There are many master's degrees among the faculty members, and each summer various teachers do graduate work and attend seminars and special courses throughout the country.

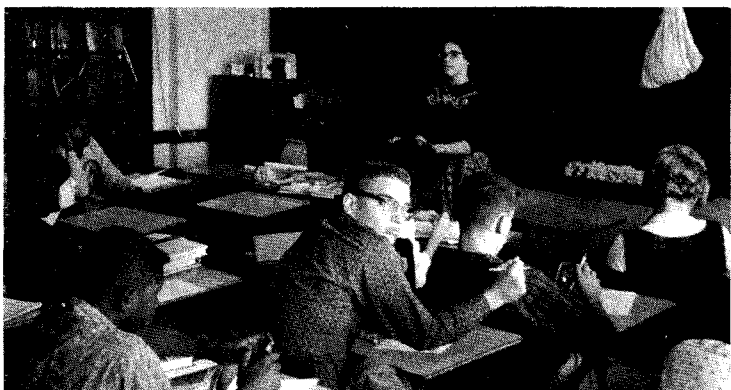

Girls learn the art of cooking in the foods classes. (Probably they have also learned the way to a man's heart is through his stomach.)



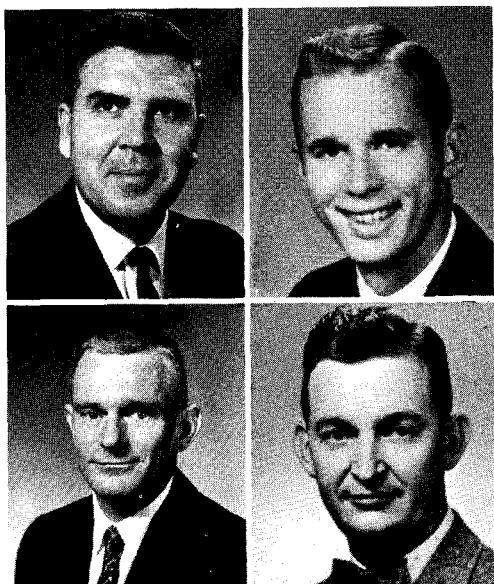
Vocational Arts

The accomplishments of the Gale are symbolic of the enthusiasm of the class in general.

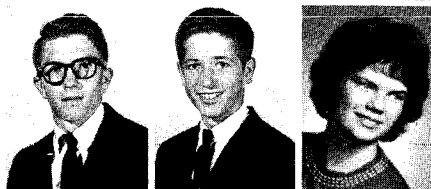

Each member participates in at least one of the intramural sports: bowling, basketball, or volleyball.

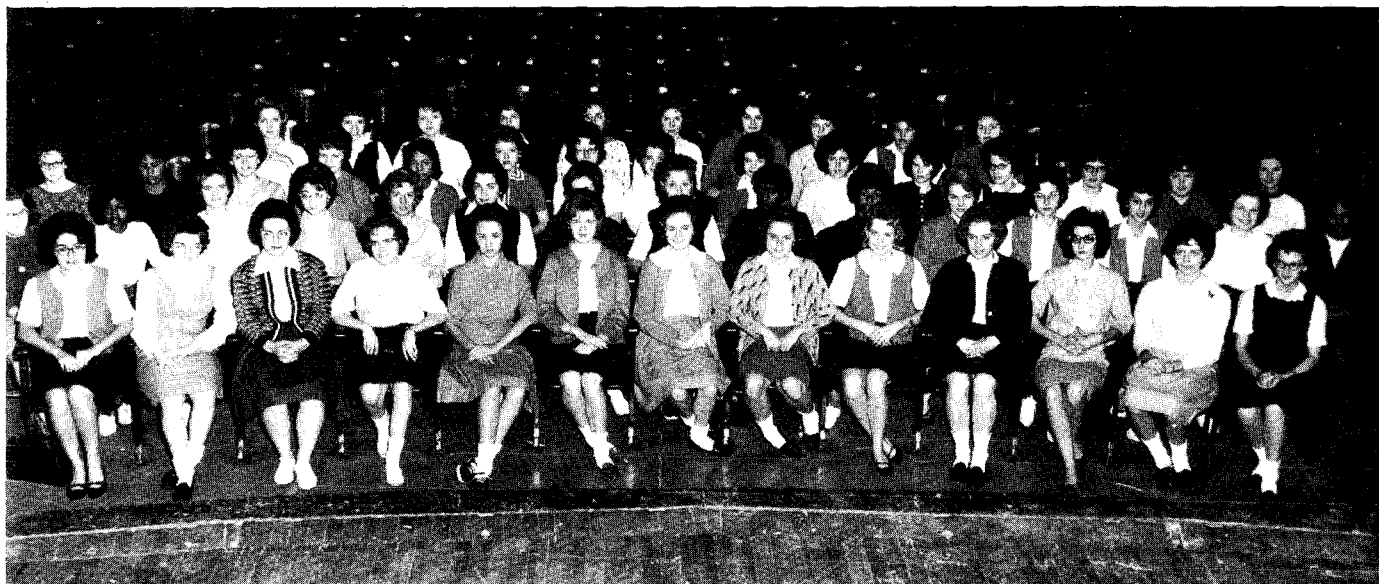

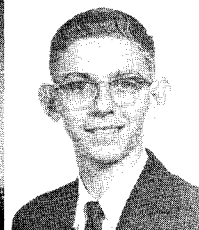
Drum Major Doug McCarter led the band in numerous activities this year. Included were football homecoming and the usual half-time entertainment at the football and basketball games.

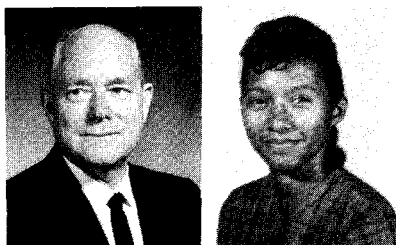

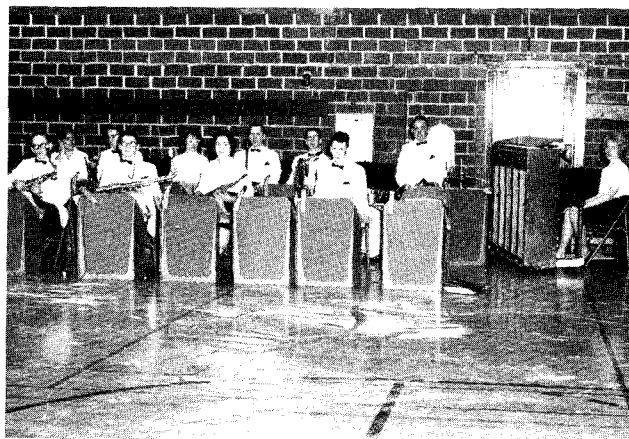

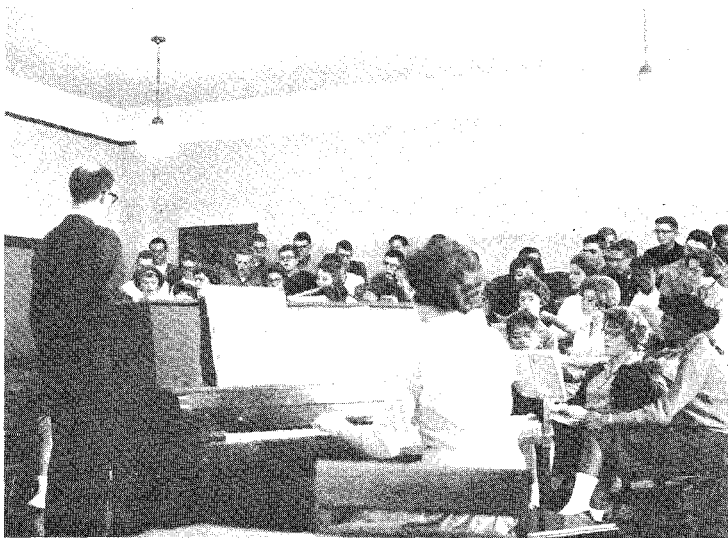
Looks To Busy Year

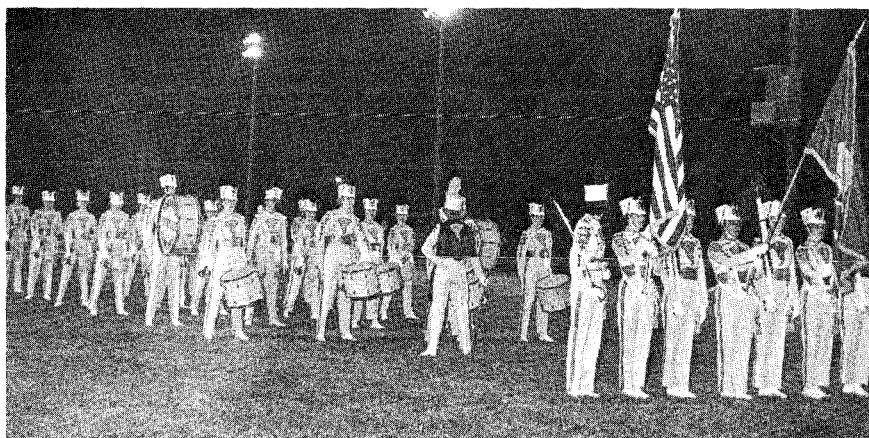

The 29th year of Drum Corps, beginning in June, started a year of wonderful memories.

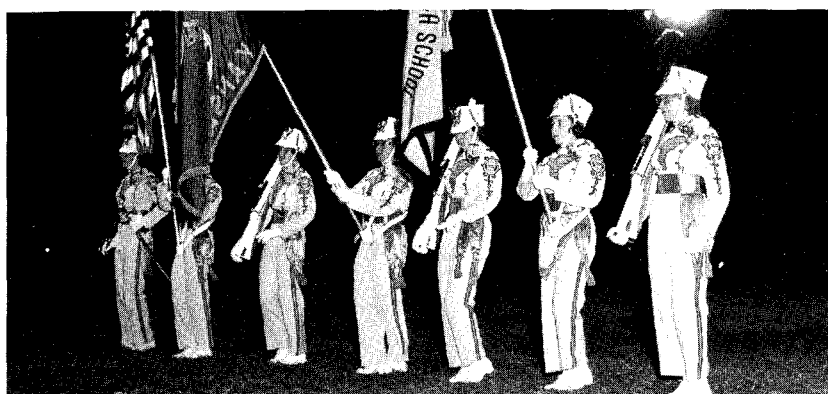
The corps' appearances began during the summer with the Inter-State Fair and Rodeo. During school they performed half-time drills for both football and basketball.

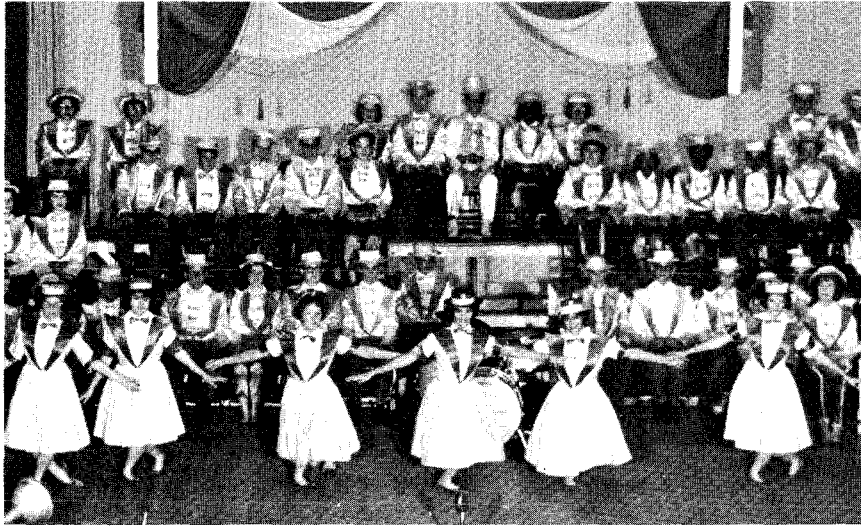

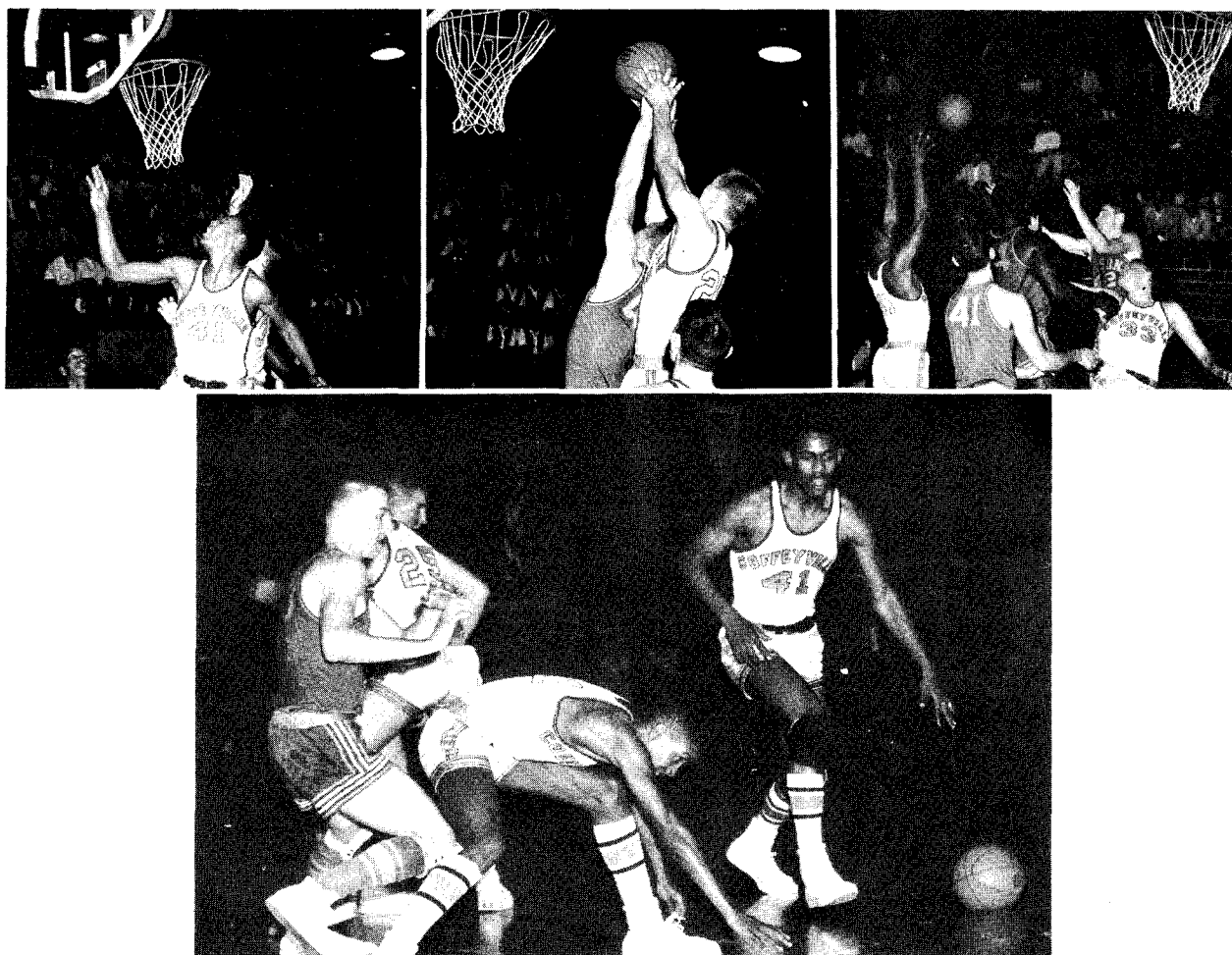
Looks to Continued Success

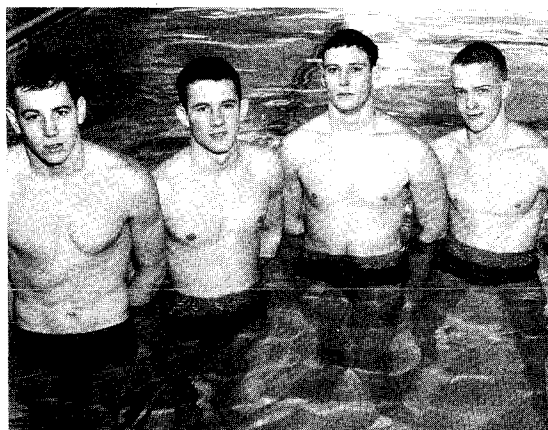

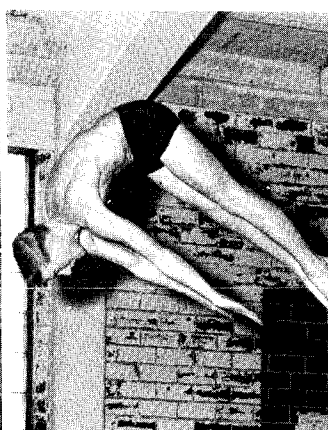
Take Second in State

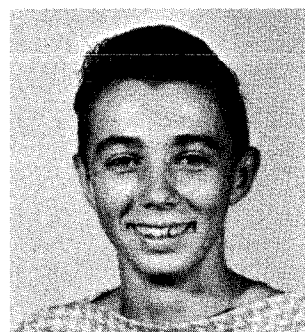
