### **“The Glass Menagerie” Character Profile**

1. Read the character descriptions on p. xviii (18) of “The Glass Menagerie”
2. Pick one character you will follow throughout the play.
3. Take notes on this character and the CD’s that help you determine who this character “is”. Consider:
  - a. Your impression of the character
  - b. Physical, mental, emotional descriptions
  - c. The character’s words and way of speaking
  - d. The character’s actions and mannerisms
  - e. What other characters say about your character
  - f. How other characters react to your character’s words and actions
4. Imagine you are a journalist creating a profile for your character. On your finished product you will:
  - a. Write a 2-chunk (10-sentence) 2:1 paragraph describing your character.
  - b. Draw a picture of your character based on the descriptions of the character in the play.
  - c. Include **at least** 2 symbolic items that are relevant to your character.
  - d. **ALL** details in your picture **MUST** be supported by CD’s that are **cited** on your picture. For example, if your character is wearing pearl earrings, you provide a quote from the play that mentions that she likes pearl earrings.
  - e. Include **at least** 4 colors in your profile

You will be assessed on the following criteria:

Your **paragraph** is a 2-chunk, 2:1 paragraph with correct spelling, punctuation and grammar. You have proof-read it and integrated the CD’s smoothly. 2 4 6 8

Your **CD’s** are relevant to your character and support your physical representation of your character. You have at least 5 CD’s present on your picture. 2 4 6 8 10 12

Your **profile picture** is accurate according to the CD’s you’ve gathered. It is clear you have spent time creating the best drawing you can given your abilities. You include at least 2 items that symbolize your character. Your illustration has at least 4 colors and are visual representations of your 5 CD’s. 5 10 15 20
