PRINCIPAL WEDAA'S MESSAGE



I am so happy to say 'Welcome Back' to *Serrania Charter for Enriched Studies* (SCES) and hope you're as excited about the coming year as I am.

It was great to see so many of you at our 'Welcome Back BBQ' - another amazing event sponsored by 'Friends of Serrania' (FOS) - featuring a DJ, dancing and great food. As always, all the money raised goes directly to helping make SCES an even better place for all our kids. I really enjoyed speaking with so many of you and finally being able to put the faces of students together with their families. One of my goals is to get to know all of you better, so please be sure to come up and say hello!

The 2013-14 school year promises to be another great year of learning and growth here at Serrania, and I'd like to welcome the more than *50* new families who've joined Serrania even as welcome all of our returning families. I feel fortunate watching our community grow and to have so many willing parent volunteers.

Our focus these first weeks of school has been to develop routines and procedures that will act as solid foundations for learning throughout the year. One of our goals is to transform our student's playground experience. As a first step, we'll have upper-grade students working as play leaders for our primary students to help them learn to play by the rules, monitor fair play and ensure everyone has a good time. Additionally, we're developing a "Student Court." This partnership of students and teachers will mediate yard situations and have students teaching students problem solving and issue resolution techniques. You can help by reinforcing all school rules which can be found in the yellow "Three Bees" booklet sent home in August.

Student safety is among our highest priorities. Inside the school, we teach behavior with the "3 Bees," develop problem solving and communication skills with "Second Step" and later in year we'll, introduce a new character development curriculum. We also regularly practice safety drills, including: fire, drop/cover hold, shelter in place and lockdown so that our students know what to do in the event of any emergency. Parents can help by emphasizing safety on the way to and from school. Remember, you are your child's first teacher and their best model for behavior – children grow up and do what their parents do. Please teach the following: 1) Always look both ways before crossing the street, never walk between parked cars and always use a crosswalk, 2) Follow all traffic rules and only park in designated areas, use our dedicated 'drop off zone' by pulling into the coned area slowly and always be patient with other parents and children.

Our commitment to students is to build their 21st Century skills through a balanced and enriched curriculum. This year, thanks to the Charter funds and the contributions of our parents through FOS, all students will participate in enrichment programs including: PE, Science lab, Computer lab, Art lab, our Library and MUSIC program (K-4). Additionally, we've added a number of targeted enrichment opportunities: Dancing Classrooms (5th), Theater Arts (2nd & 4th), Keyboards (3rd), instrumental music 4th & 5th). This is a work in progress, and we'll continue to add additional programs throughout the year. Stay tuned to learn more!

As you can see, this promises to be another exciting year at Serrania!

Serrania Suns Bring Home GOLD!

Last year, *Serrania Charter for Enriched Studies* added the award winning "Dancing Classrooms" program to our already exciting 5th grade curriculum.

The mission of the "Dancing Classrooms" initiative is to promote positive youth development, strengthen and engage schools, and bring diverse communities together through dance. The ten-week, in-school Dancing Classrooms program not only introduces kids to the world of social dance, but has proven remarkably successful at breaking down social barriers and reinforcing important concepts that include lessons in how to hon-



or and respect one another while simultaneously promoting self-confidence, communication, and cooperation.

As many of you will remember, our SCES Competition Team took part in the Dancing Classrooms Fall 2012 "Colors of the Rainbow" Team Match competition, earning a "High Gold" and qualifying for the <u>Dancing Classrooms – Los Angeles City Finals</u>, a truly remarkable feat for first-time competitors.

Over the next several months, the competition team, led by 5th grade teacher / Dance Coach Mrs. Rodstein, worked incredibly hard to continue their training – sacrificing hours of free time and dedicating a good deal of energy every week to practice and prepare for the contest.

On May 29, 2013 the eight qualifying schools from across Los Angeles gathered at *the Civitas School of Leader-ship* to put on a wonderful display of skill and artistry in front of more than 1,000 family members, friends, students, dancers, city officials, and celebrities.

Each team fielded six couples, every one ready to perform any of the selected classic ballroom dances, including the Foxtrot, Tango, Merengue, Rumba and Swing. Every couple performed at least twice and scored by a panel of professional judges... with their combined scores being used to determine the overall team champions.

After ten grueling rounds, the scores were tallied, and the winning team announced... our *Serrania Charter for Enriched Studies Competition Ballroom Dance Team* took the trophy and title of *Grand Champions!* (Be sure to stop by the main office for your chance to view the trophy they were awarded... it is enormous!)

We want to once again congratulate the members of the *SCES Competition Ballroom Team*, Mrs. Rodstein and all the parents and volunteers who helped make the program possible... what a great way to finish off the year. Now, as we start off a new year, we want to wish this year's 5th grade class "Good Luck" as they take their turn on the dance floor and try to repeat as Champions.

Cut them out, then turn them in to your teacher or the school office, and you're on your way to helping us fundraise for SCES. Ameci Box Labels: If you've ever ordered an Ameci pizza, you've likely noticed the square label on the cover of the pizza box. What you might not know is that for Serrania, those pizza box labels are part of a fundraising campaign that Ameci sponsors to support local schools. Next time you order a pizza for your family (or a dozen pizzas for a birthday



party), cut out and save those labels, and then turn them to Serrania, and FOS will turn them into fundraising dollars for our school!

Ralphs: In order to participate in the Ralphs Community Contribution program, you do need a Ralphs membership card, simply bring in this barcode to the store and they will sign you up at the register. The good news is that it's a simple process, and the better news is that once you are registered, a portion of your bill will be donated to Serrania every time you swipe that membership card. If you've signed up for Community Contributions in previous years, *you will need to register again*—Ralphs resets the program at the start of the new school year and requires all participants who wish to continue to renew.


