


### **Dedication**

We, the 1961 TWISTER staff, wish to dedicate this book to K. A. (Andy) McClure.


As you know, next year Andy will no longer be with us here at C.H.S.

### A Great Season

The Golden Tornado of 1960-61 ended their season with an excellent seven won-two lost record. The McWhirtmen finished second in the S.E.K. standings and fifth in the state.

The C.H.S. 'ers set several new records; scoring 314 points for the season, surpassing the old record of 296 points in 1957; scoring the most points on Ise Field with a 70-7 romp over Fort Scott; Ron Holman set records for extra-points in one season with 29 and with a 38 yard field goal.

Coffeyville placed high on the all-S.E.K. team with Dave Schichtle, Ron Murphy, Fred Decker, Mike Lewark, Jim Gaffney, and Bob Templer being named; while Tim Wettack, Ron Holman, and Ken Hendrix received honorable mention. Fred Decker was placed on the Wichita Beacon's All-State team and Dave Schichtle received the nod for the second team All-State for the Topeka Capital.

This year's squad was one of the lightest teams to play under the name Tornado. The line averaged only 170 lbs., while the back averaged 165 lbs. The "Tightwads", the defensive unit, was created this year and they made an excellent showing. They held Joplin to seven yards in the second half and Parsons to no first downs. Although this year's squad did not win the championship, it is generally agreed that this was one of the great teams to play for C.H.S.







### The Golden Tornado

(2nd in S.E.K. - 6th in State)

In regular play, the 1960-'61 edition of the Golden Tornado roundballers placed second in the SEK league with a 12-2 record. After defeating Ft. Scott 49-37, Independence 57-42, Altamont 56-44, and Columbus 71-57, the Tornado was unable to find the basket range and lost to Parsons 56-49.

Rebounding back the Tornado won their next 13 games and set a new record for successive games won. First of the victims was Iola, followed by Pittsburg, Ft. Scott, and Chanute.

At the Campus High basketball tournament, the Cagers defeated Washington, Bethel, Campus High, and the tough Shawnee Mission North teams to capture first place and bring home a fine trophy.

Continuing their victorious ways, the Tornado dropped Independence, Columbus, Parsons (then rated first in the state), Iola, Pittsburg, and Joplin.

In the last game of the season, against Chanute, the Tornado again had trouble locating the mark and lost a heart-breaker 54-50 in overtime.

The Golden Boys then entered the Regionals with a respectable 17-2 record, which was good enough to draw them a bye in first night of competition. In the semi-finals C'ville breezed past Pittsburg by a score of 84-61. Then in the championship tilt, the Tornado witnessed the third and last defeat of the 1960-'61 season by a mighty Parsons crew 67-57, aided by a low shooting percentage by the locals. CHS ended up sixth in the state.

Dave Schichtle was selected unanimously to the SEK team for the 2nd year in a row while teammate Elmer Shade was chosen on the top ten also. Seniors Ron Murphy and Ken Hendrix, and junior Jim Moore received honorable mention, the only starting five in the league to be so recognized.



### The Golden Gale


