### 2015-2016 School Calendar and Work Days

For the 2015-2016 school year we stay on a days based calendar and still use calamity days and professional development waiver days. This means, in the case of inclement weather, WE HAVE FIVE SNOW DAYS LIKE ALWAYS.

We will submit a Blizzard Bag resolution/plan to ODE and have adopted a calamity day make up plan as follows:

**Calamity Day Plan-** In compliance with state law we will have the following calamity day make up plan.

- Calamity Days 1-5 will be waived by state superintendent
- Calamity Days 6, 7 and 8 will be made up utilizing board/state approved blizzard bags
- Calamity Day 9- Occurring before February 5 will be made up on Conference Exchange Day on February 12
- Calamity Days 9, 10, 11, 12- if used will be made up on May 25, 26, 27, 31
