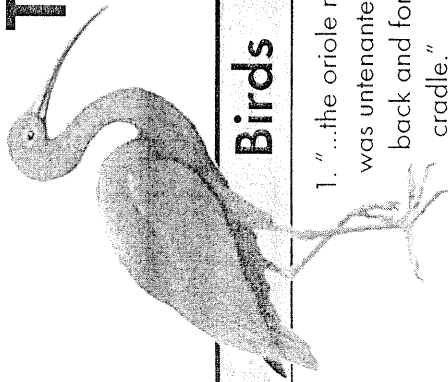


The Scarlet Ibis
