Schools receive additional credit for exceptional graduation and college/career readiness outcomes of students with disabilities, English Language Learners, and students who enter high school at a low performance level.

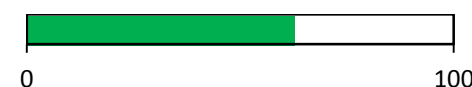

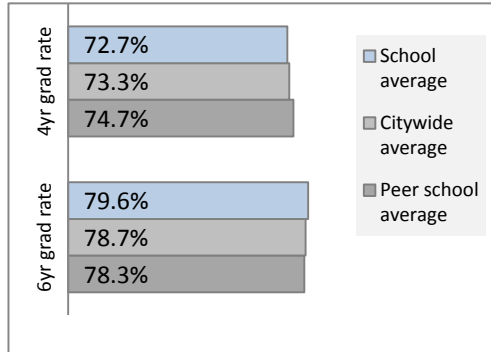

Four year Graduation Rate

In 2013, New Dorp High School's four year graduation rate was 72.7%. This was similar to the average overall four year graduation rate of high schools in 2013. Compared to other schools in the city serving students with similar characteristics, New Dorp High School's four year graduation rate was statistically similar.

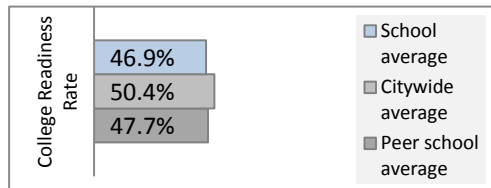
Six year Graduation Rate

In 2013, New Dorp High School's six year graduation rate was 79.6%. This was similar to the average overall six year graduation rate of high schools in 2013. Compared to other schools in the city serving students with similar characteristics, New Dorp High School's six year graduation rate was statistically similar.

How well did this school prepare its students for college?



To answer this question, we looked at the percentage of students who entered high school in September of 2007 and who graduated and met the Regents exam, SAT and/or course standards for passing out of remedial coursework at CUNY by August 2013. We also included students who enrolled and persisted in college through the beginning of their third semester.

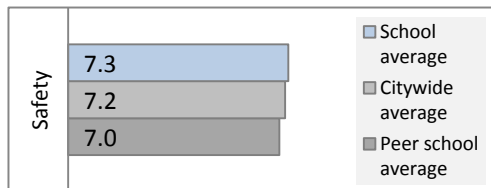
College Readiness Rate (including persistence)

After six years, students from New Dorp High School were similarly prepared for college compared to other students in the city. Compared to students from high schools serving similar populations, the students from New Dorp High School were prepared similarly.

How safe is this school?



The NYC School Survey is one of the largest surveys of any kind conducted nationally. This year nearly a million responses were collected. The survey collects responses from parents, teachers and students in grades 6-12.
