Edwards says that all of the good things that a person does can not keep him/her out of hell. He compares those things to a spider’s web and sinners to a fallen rock that would fall right through into hell.	The audience would understand that all of the things they thought would save them will not and that they should convert to avoid falling. It appeals to fear because they wouldn’t want to fall into the pit of hell.
