



With these purposes as their guides, the staff of the 1964 *TWISTER* proudly presents their work to you.

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


The administrators of Field Kindley are concerned with curriculum development, school personnel, school activities, finances, and community relations as well as the development of each student.



During each of the four years, outstanding students work in "Honors" classes in which they develop special aptitudes and talents.








Scientists Improve Teaching Methods




Bruce Dodson, Vernon Conger, David Kendrick and Larry Brown set up apparatus for an experiment in laboratory science class.


Courses of the Field Kindley science department have been updated this year.

For the first time in our high school, the new PSSC physics course is offered. This is the product of a study by high school and college physics teachers under the sponsorship of MIT. In this course, more emphasis is being placed on laboratory work. The lab facilities of Field Kindley are completely equipped for the new approach. The modern Chemical Bond Approach course in chemistry was instituted as the necessary equipment was secured.

New microscopes have been added, and a more comprehensive laboratory course in biology is now being offered. The additional equipment makes one microscope available for each two students.






By using materials furnished by the School Mathematics Study Group (SMSG), the math classes at CHS receive a greater insight into the world of math.

Honors classes in math are offered in geometry and algebra. Members for these classes are selected from the accelerated algebra class of junior high.

In the honors course of algebra 3-4, the students need not have been in accelerated math courses before. The same books are used in both classes; however, supplemental material is supplied from SMSG for the honors class.

Seniors, although not offered an honors course, receive additional training in preparation for calculus in the freshman year at college.




Business Courses Attract Many Students

Teaching the basic skills needed for the business world and their application to business situations are the foremost objectives of the teachers in the commercial department. This year brought an ever-increasing number of students seeking this training.

For the first time in many years the demand for office practice instruction and business English was so great that two sections in each were necessary. This year, a revision in stenography instruction decreased the number of characters to be mastered by nearly one half.



Laboratory Aids Language Study

In Latin more emphasis is placed on writing than speaking the language.


These courses strive to help the student achieve increasing confidence, fluency, and understanding of the new language.



This year there was only one choir group other than the robed choir. It was a non-performing group.








Five Senior Tornado Make ALL-SEK Team

Fans saw the Tornado squeeze out a win over the Chanute Comets to bring an air of victory to the homecoming festivities.


Later in the season the team emerged victorious over the Iola Mustangs, bringing the season to a close with two wins and seven losses.






Intramurals Provide Varied Program


Although bowling seemed to have the highest percentage of participation, basketball ran a close second.

Tumbling techniques developed in the intramural program are demonstrated by Pam Giger, Russell Olewinski, and Terry Blake.




Basketball was one of the more popular intramurals for boys.




Pam Giger entertains as part of the tumbling exhibition during halftime of the Columbus basketball game.







Bruce Dodson begins approach at Edgewood Lanes during afternoon session of intramural bowling.

On January 17, at Emporia State Teachers College, Coffeyville's Debate Squad was named the 1964 Kansas State Champions.










High By Audiences

The performances which were given during the week of February 3, climaxed the work of some 250 students and faculty members and nearly a year of advance planning.






Council Drafts Code for Student Conduct







GAA Assists Girls



FFA Is Active Group





Key Club Meets at CHS









The dinner orchestra, a select group from the orchestra, played before service clubs, for the Sigma Pi dinner, and at the Kay-Kayette Convention.





Subscribers readily took to the change and hailed the "new look" as a great advancement.






1964 *Twister* Staff Follows New Trend



Throughout the year of transition, the "prepsters" acquainted themselves with CHS and joined school organizations.




Highlighting the junior year was the Prom and reception, "Bon Voyage." Many class members assisted with other activities during that middle year.
