

てんき Requirements

Write and present a weather forecast in にほんご.

The presentation must be **memorized and equally divided**. Reading is -40%

Presentation may be done live or pre-taped on video. (must have eye contact on video)

(If taped presentation memorization is questionable, students must be prepared to recite lines to Sensei in class to prove memorization. Otherwise, 40% will be deducted.)

(For live presentation only - Notes may be used as reference)

Requirements:

1. Choose 3 different cities to report a long range forecast.
 - a. The forecast includes temperatures for each day and night.
All temperatures must be in Celcius. $C = \frac{5}{9}(F - 32)$
(10% deduction for not converting, not realistic)
ALL NUMBERS WRITTEN IN JAPANESE (hiragana or kanji)
 - b. The forecast includes type of weather (rain, clear, cloudy etc) and (hot, warm, cold, cool) for each day.
 - c. The forecast must mention how the weather will affect activities and events.

City 1: 3 day forecast

City 2: 3 day forecast

City 3: 5 day forecast

2. Choose 2 disasters or unusual weather to report.
3. Visual Aids and Dress – NO ENGLISH on VISUAL AIDS
Visual aids must include Japanese weather symbols discussed in class
(sunny, cloudy, windy, rain, snow)
4. Use of appropriate language level and grammar
5. Turn in a final written copy of your script.
