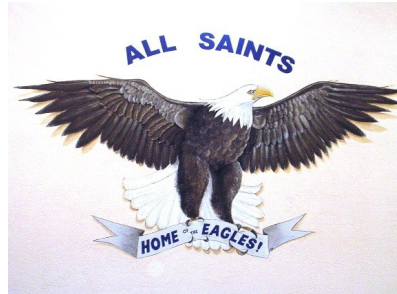

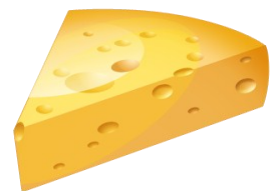
- ◆ A typical hurricane has the amount of energy equivalent to 8,000 one megaton bombs.

North Dakota has the lowest with 3.5.



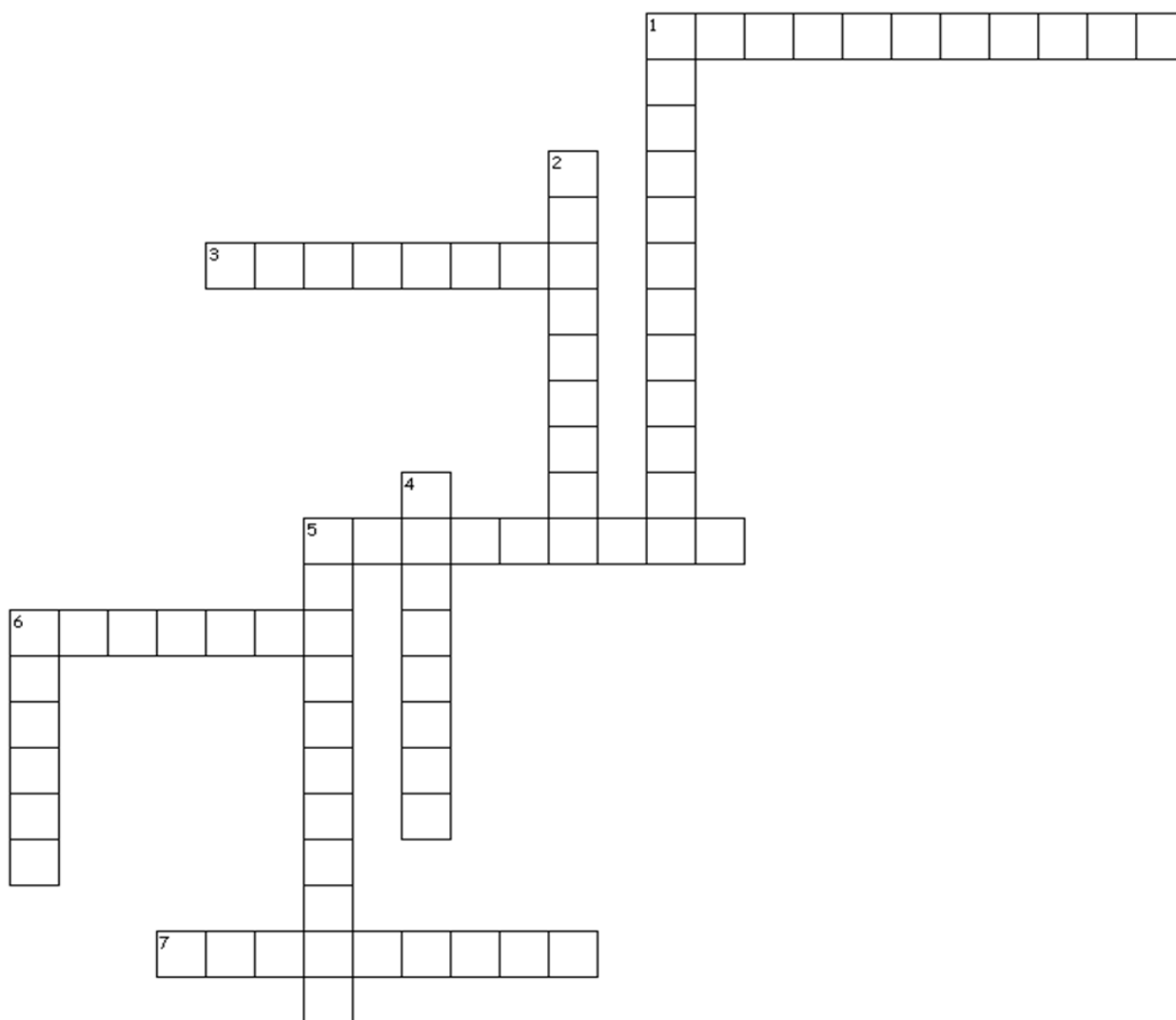
