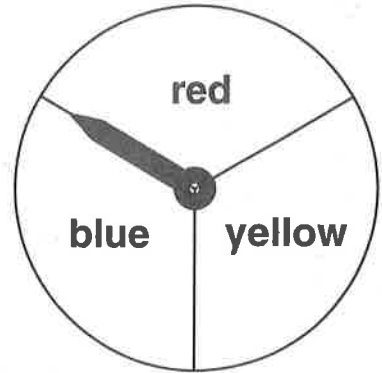

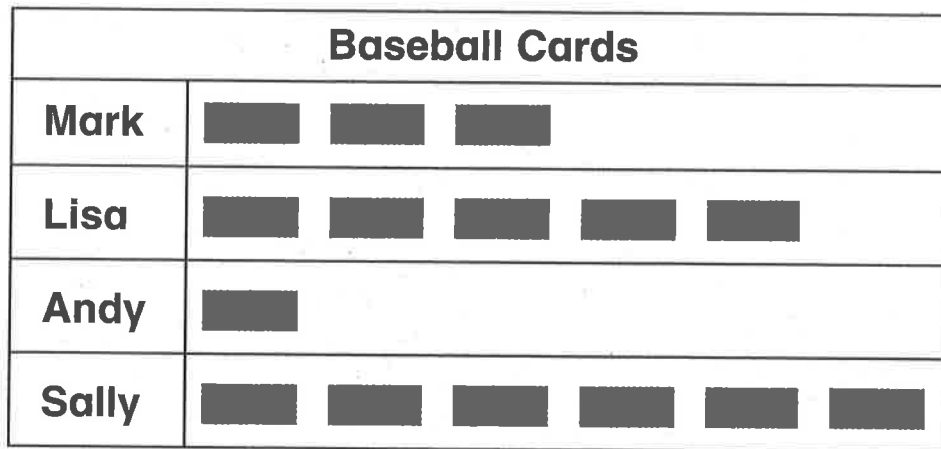

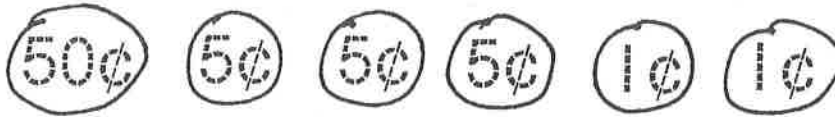

Veterans Day

Veterans are people who have served the U.S. in the Army, the Air Force, the Navy, the Marine Corps, or the Coast Guard. Each of these groups has different jobs.

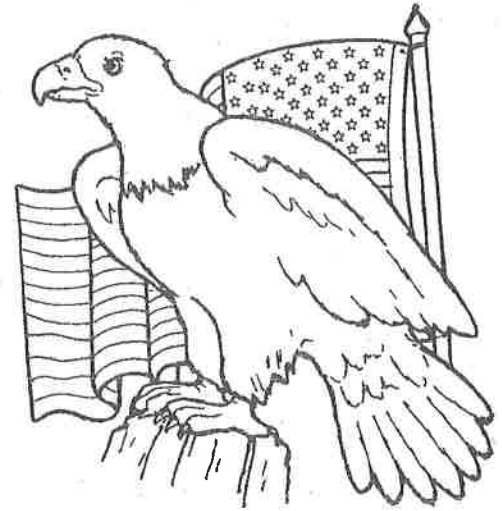
The Army performs combat actions on land. It also helps during disasters or emergencies. The Army builds and operates such things as dams and waterways.

The Air Force performs combat actions in the air. Some members work with the U.S. space program. The Air Force airlifts supplies to disaster areas.

The Navy performs combat actions at sea. It takes food and supplies to disaster areas and helps during emergencies.

The Marine Corps performs combat actions on both land and water. It guards U.S. officials in other countries.

The Coast Guard enforces the laws of the sea and U.S. waterways. It performs rescues at sea and assists the Navy.
