Course Selection

- Holy Family University will offer Holy Family courses here on campus at Archbishop Ryan to eligible seniors and juniors
- Can take one or two Holy Family courses for both high school and college credit
- These courses also become a part of an unofficial college transcript, meaning that they may satisfy college core requirements

- Eligible students must carry a minimum of five Ryan courses.
 - For a student who carries five Ryan courses, that student must select two Holy Family courses, one each semester (Fall and Spring).
 - If a student carries six Ryan courses, that student may elect to take just one Holy Family course in the Fall but may also take an additional course in the Spring.

- The cost per course to Ryan students is just \$200, plus the cost of books.
- Typically, a student taking college courses part time at a local college or university can pay as much as two thousand dollars per course
