





When the season ended, the entire squad had acquired a total of 72 wins and 62 losses with some of the individual teams winning 75% of their debates.





#### F. F. A. HIGHLIGHTS


This year for the first time, F.F.A. membership was extended to the freshman class. The freshman total 22 out of the entire 50 boys.


