Rhetorical/Lit Devices Folder

This semester you will be working at becoming Master Rhetoricians. This will be a semi-independent project you will be working on throughout the course of the semester. In your Rhet/Lit Devices Folder you will include:

- **At least** 30 rhetorical devices
- Cover pages for each device
- Completed chart for each device
 - **At least** 10 examples of each device from readings
- **Assessment:** Each part of your folder will be assessed on completeness and accuracy. Your cover pages are worth **5** points each and your chart pages are worth **30** points each (3 points per example), for a total of **35** points per rhetorical device.

Cover Pages

- Name of the rhetorical device
- An illustration that will help you remember what it does

Parallelism

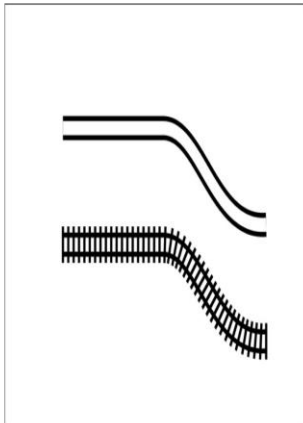


Chart Pages

- Definition of the rhetorical device at the top
- Quotation, properly cited **with page number**.
- Explanation of why it fits the definition AND the effect it has on the reader.
- MLA citation of the source (check Purdue OWL for proper citation)

Example:

Definition: Similarity of structure in a pair or [series](#) of related words, phrases, or clauses.

Quote	Explanation/Effect	Citation
"They went running, jumping and hiking." (Collier, 34)	This is an example of parallelism because it uses the present perfect form (-ing) in all three verbs. This puts the reader in the moment with the main character, enabling her to feel empathy toward the subject.
