RECOMMENDATION:

Approval is recommended to adopt the expenditure plan for the Common Core State Standards implementation funds in the total amount of \$3,295,788 in accordance with AB 86, section 85(d).

BACKGROUND:

As part of the 2013-14 State Adopted Budget, the Huntington Beach Union High School District received \$3,295,788 for implementation of Common Core State Standards (CCSS). HBUHSD developed a plan delineating how these funds were to be spent in accordance with Assembly Bill (AB) 86, Section 85. Per AB 85, funds must be expended on professional development, instructional materials, and/or technology aligned to the academic content standards. Funds must be fully encumbered by July 1, 2015.

The \$3,295,788 spending plan, as described in the public board meetings on September 12, 2013 and October 8, 2013, is summarized below:

Instructional Materials -5 - 15% (\$160,000 - \$480,000)

- Textbooks, open-source materials and supplemental materials

Technology -60 - 70% (\$1.92 - \$2.24 million)

- Wireless Internet Access for all schools
- Chromebooks, computer accessories (mice, earbuds, etc. in support of Smarter Balance testing)
- Network Infrastructure upgrades
- Computer replacement/refresh

Professional Development – 20 – 35% (\$640,000 - \$1.12 million)

- Staff Development
- Summer Institute in support of CCSS

Administration

Conflict of Interest Code:

Pursuant to the District's Resolution No. 47 dated November 18, 2014, it has adopted the State of California's Model Code, Including Designated Filers List, for Conflict of Interests.

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which may be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix designating officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories (Exhibit B), shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Huntington Beach Union High School District.

Designated employees (Exhibit A) shall file statements of economic interests with the Huntington Beach Union High School District's Political Reform Act Filing Officer, who will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Government Code Section 82008). Upon receipt of the statements, the Filing Officer shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of these statements to the Clerk of the Orange County Board of Supervisors, or keep the original on file, in accordance with Exhibits A and B.

The terms of Title 2, California Code of Regulations, Section 18730 (Attachment A) and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, together with Exhibits A and B in which members and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Huntington Beach Union High School District.

<u>Section 2.</u> The provisions of all Conflict of Interest Codes and Amendments thereto previously adopted by the Huntington Beach Union High School District and hereby superseded.

Section 3. The Filing Officer is hereby authorized to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Clerk of the Orange County Board of Supervisors for review and approval by the Orange County Board of Supervisors as required by California Government Code Section 87303.
