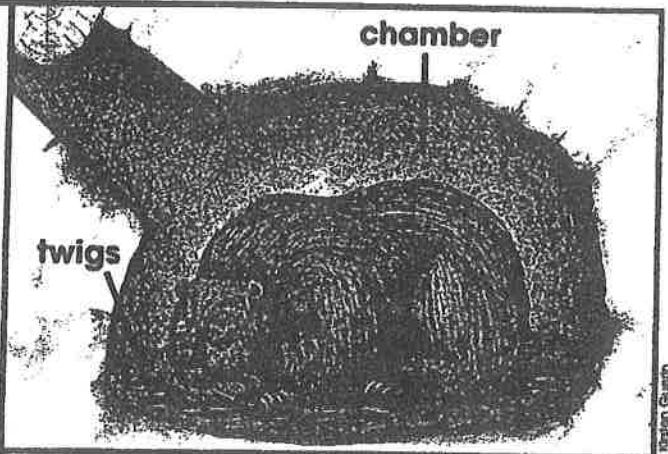

Bears in Winter

Most bears **hibernate** (HIGH-ber-nayt). That means they sleep through the winter. Bears hibernate when it gets cold and it is hard to find food.

In the fall, bears eat to build up fat. Before winter, they go into caves called dens to hibernate. They breathe slower, and their hearts beat slower. Bears do not need to eat or drink when they hibernate. They use their fat to stay alive. Bears wake up in the spring when the weather is warmer.

Fast Facts About a Fast Cat

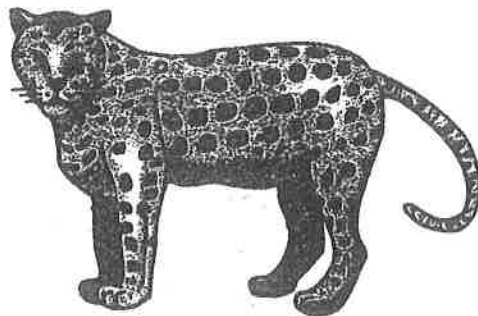
Read about the cheetah. Then answer the questions below.

A Fast Cat

The cheetah belongs to the cat family, but it has a doglike shape. In addition to being the fastest land animal, the cheetah has excellent eyesight. That helps it hunt for food and watch for danger.

A young cheetah, or **cub**, stays with its mother until it is almost fully grown. The cub learns to hunt and to defend itself.

The cheetah is **endangered**, or dying out. That is because people have been taking over its habitat in the African grasslands to build farms.
