Grammar: Common and Proper Nouns

A **noun** is a word that names a person, place, or thing. Nouns name things that can be seen and touched as well as those that cannot be seen and touched. Notice in the following chart that among the things nouns can name are ideas, actions, conditions, and qualities.

People: Aunt Cele, Esteban, musicians, doctor
Places: Sacramento, Lincoln Park Zoo, mountain, desert, park, lake
See and touch: grass, dish, table, truck
Ideas and actions: freedom, confusion, election, censorship
Conditions and qualities: optimism, courage, shyness, bewilderment

A **common noun** names any one of a class of people, places, or things—for example, *day*, *river*, or *woman*. A **proper noun** names a specific person, place, or thing and always begins with a capital letter—for example, *Tuesday*, *Cuyahoga River*, or *Harriet Tubman*. In the following example, the common nouns are underlined and the proper nouns are in boldface.

Example from “New Directions”

He did not tell her that he knew a minister in Enid with whom he could study and who had a friendly, unmarried daughter. They parted amicably, Annie keeping the one-room house and William taking most of the cash to carry him to Oklahoma.
