What got you started in Youth Ministry?

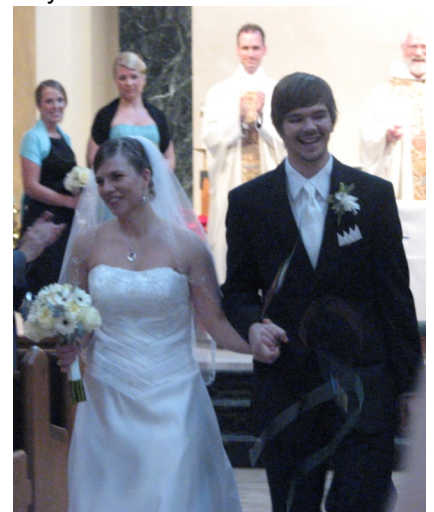

Your Change Can Help Change a Nation: Mrs. Charlton's 7th Grade Class Project is Making a Difference

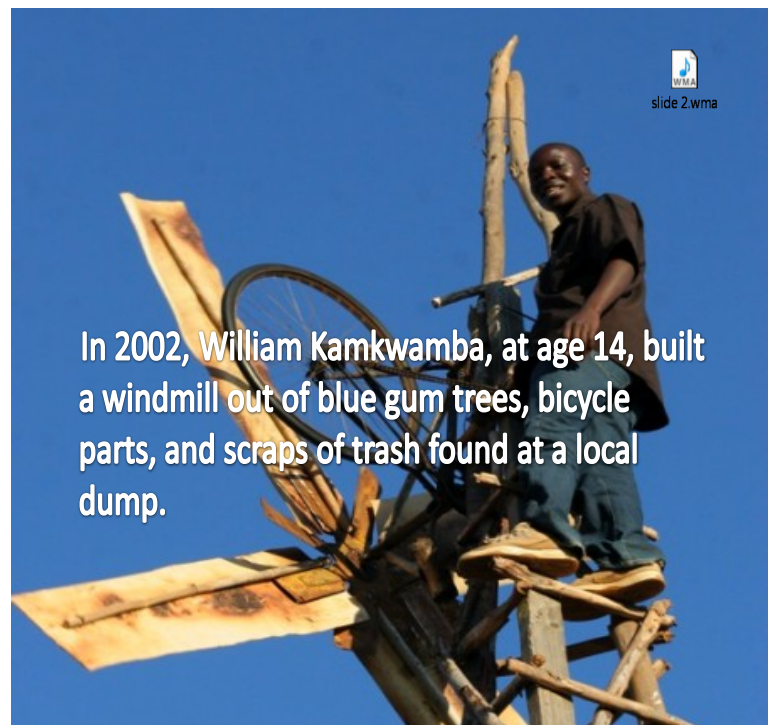
First, the seventh grade advanced English class read the autobiography, *The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind* by William Kamkwamba. William, a native of Malawi, Africa, was forced to drop out of school at an early age when his parents could no longer afford his tuition. His family had been greatly affected by drought and famine in Malawi. William helped his father in the fields but also spent much of his time reading in his small village's library. It was there he found books on electricity and windmills. If he could build his own windmill, he would be able to bring light to his family's home, and later on, he could generate electricity for a pump to irrigate the crops.

At 14, William accomplished this task by creating a windmill out of scraps he collected in the junk yard. Even though he could not read that well, he was able to figure out the diagrams in the books he looked at. Some people thought he was crazy for attempting this task, but William succeeded and soon gained the attention of his country and of the world.

Malawi is a very poor African nation. An American dollar goes very far there. My students were inspired by William to raise money for his village/country, and purchase a windmill. It costs \$250 to buy a windmill in Malawi. The campaign was held January 24 -31. Our school raised slightly over \$300. While we did not have a competition between classes, those that raised the most were Mrs. Heater's, Mrs. Charlton's, and Mrs. Reid's homerooms.

Prior to the fundraising campaign, the seventh graders learned about advertising terms and worked on skits, commercials, and power point presentations to get the word out to the school regarding their campaign. Each student also had to design a donation container for each classroom that was used to collect the money. Students also made flyers that were placed throughout the building.

At the suggestion of one of our kindergarten students, Kenny Hauck, the next Jeans for Scholarship Day on March 25 will allow students to help purchase another windmill for Malawi. For \$3 on that day, students may wear jeans with a bright colored shirt (to symbolize the bright colors of Africa) ~ \$1 of that total will go to the purchase of another windmill.
