

How To Prepare for Effective Parent-Teacher Conferences

Believe it or not, parent—teacher conferences are just around the corner — your first real opportunity to meet your child's teacher and ask about their progress and how they are doing so far in the school year. If you're like most of us, you probably have lots of questions but are challenged by the need to balance all you'd like to cover with just how little time there seems to do it! Well, fear not... we're ready to help! Read on to learn how to make the most of these important meetings.

First, it's important to know that most conferences are about 20 minutes in length, and the better prepared you are going in the more beneficial the meeting will be for you and your child's teacher. Here are some tips you can do before, during, and after your meeting.

- Ask your child how things are going at school, and what he or she would like you to ask the teacher. What does your child like best about school? Are there any subjects he/she is having trouble with?
- Write down your questions beforehand and take a notepad and pen with you to the meeting to jot down any notes in case you may forget something.
- Inform the teacher of any relevant information, such as changes at home. A new baby, divorce, etc. can all affect the way your child behaves in the classroom.
- Size up the social scene. How well your child fits in socially can affect how well he learns. Ask the teacher how he gets along with the other students. Does he always hang out at recess with the same kids? Who are they? Is anyone picking on him?
- Lastly, find out the best way to follow-up with the teacher. Review any decisions you've made together, and follow-up! If you feel it's necessary, request another meeting.

Some sample questions you can ask during the meeting:

At what grade level is your child performing? Is the teacher concerned about your child's ability to get along with others and participate in class? How is your child doing in relation to the rest of the class? What special help can you or I offer my child to get him on track?

According to Mrs. Austin, a kindergarten teacher at Serrania for over 25 years, the most important aspect in getting your child on the right track is teaching them good school habits early on. A lot of students come to class tardy, which can affect their overall per-



formance. At this age they need consistency and a stress free environment. Working with them for ten minutes a day, and reading to them at a higher level can make all the difference in the world!

The **Peer Mediation Project**, led by 5th grade teacher and GATE Coordinator, Ms. Sperber, will get select 4th and 5th grade volunteers trained in conflict resolution to help their fellow students find positive resolutions to playground conflicts. In addition to the obvious benefits of a safer, happier playground, this is a tremendous opportunity for all of our students to be leaders and learn from peer role models.

We are pleased to announce the return of *SCES Student Council* led by Ms. Czigler and Ms. Vassallo. Student Council will work together to transform Serrania with an eye on the students' perspective. Their first goal is to start a "peace team" as part of the October Anti-Bullying Month.

This past September we were lucky enough to have <u>Shane</u>, a <u>severely handicapped wheelchair basketball player</u>, visit with our 2nd - 5th grade students. Shane spoke about respect, celebrating diversity in each of us, and including those with special needs. Many students were moved by how Shane opened their minds to the value each and every person can contribute.

In its 2nd year, our *Kids in the Community* program gives students a direct opportunity to give back to their community through events like the "Halloween Costume and Candy Drive" and the 'Thanksgiving Food Drive." Giving back to their own community can have a profound impact on our kids' self esteem and appreciation for all that they have.

The <u>Serrania Stars!</u> program is a school-wide effort to teach students the value of our own Serrania community, and the need to build respect for each other. We are working together to take better care of our environment and clean up after ourselves in the lunch area. Additionally, at each Friday morning assembly, we will recognize students who have made a difference or have done a good deed. We will also recognize students who want to perform and share their own culture. Once a month, each teacher presents citizenship awards for his or her class.

I hope you'll take a moment to learn about these exciting initiatives... and that you'll make a point of discussing them with your family and think of ways you can contribute. Together, the students, parents and staff at *Serrania Charter for Enriched Studies* (SCES) can make a positive difference in the lives of people throughout our community!

Accelerated Reader

Accelerated Reader (AR) is our *Friends of Serrania* (FOS) funded on-line reading comprehension program that develops fluency, vocabulary, and a love of reading. Students read a book, take a quiz at school, and earn points for awards and prizes. This past September, more than 75 students met their AR point goal!

Each month, the class with the highest percent of students meeting their AR goals

will be recognized. Congratulations this month goes to Ms. Williams and her first grade class. In September, **92%** of the class, that's 22 out of 24 students, met their AR goals! Read a book, take a quiz, and race to reading success! Points will be counted on November 20th, so be sure to get reading and take your quizzes!
