Chapter Bylaws
Of the
Goshen High School Chapter
Of the
National Honor Society

### ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this chapter shall be the Goshen High School Chapter of the National Honor Society.

## ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this chapter shall be to create an enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote worthy leadership, and to encourage the development of character in students of Goshen High School.

#### ARTICLE III: POWERS

Section 1: This chapter operates under the direction of and in full compliance with the National Constitution of NHS. See <a href="https://www.nhs.us/constitutions">www.nhs.us/constitutions</a>.

Section 2. The chapter adviser is given the authority to supervise the administration of chapter activities, as delegated by the school principal.

Section 3: Final authority on all activities and decisions of the chapter resides with the school principal. [For reference, see Article V, Section 1 of the National Constitution.]

Section 4: Non-discrimination. Our chapter of NHS maintains policies and practices that are designed to prevent discrimination against any qualified candidate or member on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex (gender), and disability. This policy of nondiscrimination applies to all practices, including the chapter administration and the selection, discipline, and dismissal of members.

## ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership in this chapter is an honor bestowed upon deserving students by the faculty and shall be based on the criteria of Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character.

Section 2. Membership in this chapter shall be known as active, honorary, and graduate. Active members become graduate members at graduation. Graduate and honorary members have no voice or vote in chapter affairs.

## Section 3. Eligibility:

a. Candidates eligible for selection to this chapter must be members of the junior or senior class and attend GHS for a minimum of **FOUR** academic classes per day.

- b. To be eligible for selection to membership in this chapter, the candidate must have been enrolled for a period equivalent to one semester at Goshen High School.
- c. Candidates eligible for selection to the chapter shall have a minimum cumulative weighted grade point average of 3.75 on a 4.0 scale.
- d. Candidates eligible for selection must have a 93% attendance rate as reflected by State standards.
- e. Upon meeting the grade level, enrollment, attendance, and GPA standards, candidates shall then be considered based on their service, leadership, and character.
- Section 4.- Members in good academic standing and possessing good attendance in school are eligible to receive the scholarship information for the NHS scholarship. The recipients of the information will be determined by random draw by the adviser in sight of all members present at the monthly meeting.

#### ARTICLE V: SELECTION OF MEMBERS

Section 1. The selection of members to this chapter shall be by a majority vote of the Faculty Council which consists of five faculty members. The chapter advisor shall be a sixth, non-voting, ex-officio member of the Faculty Council.

Section 2. The selection of active members shall be held once a year during second semester of the school year.

Section 3. Prior to the final selection, the following shall occur:

- a. Students' academic records shall be reviewed to determine scholastic eligibility.
- b. Students who are eligible scholastically(i.e. candidates) shall be notified and asked to complete and submit the Student Activity Information Form for further consideration.
- c. The faculty shall be requested to evaluate candidates determined to be scholastically eligible using the official evaluation form provided to the candidates by the chapter adviser.
- d. The Faculty Council shall review the Student Activity Information Form, faculty evaluations and other relevant information to determine those who fully meet the selection criteria for membership.
- Section 4. Candidates become members when inducted at a special ceremony.

Section 5. An active member of the National Honor Society who transfers from this school will be given an official letter indicating the status of his/her membership.

Section 6. An active member of the National Honor Society who transfers to this school will be automatically accepted for membership in this chapter. The Faculty Council shall grant to the transferring member one semester to attain the membership requirements and, thereafter, this member must maintain those requirements for this chapter in order to retain his/her membership.

#### ARTICLE VI: OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS

Section 1. Annual dues for this chapter shall be \$10. Dues will be payable to the chapter within 30 days of induction.

Section 2. Each member of this chapter who is in good standing with regard to the membership standards and member obligations shall be entitled to wear the emblem adopted by the National Honor Society.

Section 3. Any member who withdraws, resigns, or is dismissed from the chapter shall return the emblem to the chapter.

Section 4. Chapter members who are seniors in good standing shall be granted the privilege of wearing the honor cords or stole at graduation as decided by the current seniors.

Section 5. Members will complete two service hours per month in addition to the group activity for the month. Members should follow the guidelines as outlined on the monthly hours documentation sheet. Members unable to attend the group service project will complete additional hours equal to those of the group service project for that month.

## ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the chapter shall be president, vice president, secretary, and project coordinator.

Section 2. Student officers shall be elected at the last meeting of each school year. All returning members in good standing with the chapter are eligible to run for a position as an officer. Any active member can nominate an eligible member as a candidate for office.

Section 3. Voting shall be by secret ballot. A majority vote shall be necessary to elect any officer of this chapter. If the first vote does not yield a majority, a second vote shall be taken of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the president to preside at the meetings of the chapter, and serve as the official representative of the chapter at school and community functions.

Section 5. The vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president and shall also keep a record of members' contributions to leadership and service.

Section 6. The secretary shall keep the minutes and attendance records for meetings and be responsible for all official correspondence.

Section 7. The project coordinator shall create and distribute all advertising for chapter activities and service projects.

Section 8. Officers and the faculty adviser(s) shall collectively be known as the chapter's Executive Committee. The executive committee shall establish annual goals for the chapter and have general charge of the meetings and the business of the chapter, but any action by the executive committee is subject to the review of the chapter members.

#### ARTICLE VIII: MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular meetings of this chapter shall be held the first Wednesday of each month. Special meetings can be called by the president with approval of the adviser.

Section 2. Members are expected to attend all chapter meetings. If a member is unable to attend the meeting, the member must notify the adviser PRIOR to the meeting unless absent from school that day.

## ARTICLE IX: ACTIVITIES

Section 1. The chapter shall determine one or more service projects for each month.

Section 2. All members shall regularly participate in these projects.

Section 3. These projects shall have the following characteristics: fulfill a need within the school or community, have the support of the administration and the faculty, be appropriate and educationally defensible, and be well-planned, organized, and executed.

Section 4. Each member shall have the responsibility for choosing and participating in an individual service project which reflects his or her particular talents and interests and as approved by the chapter adviser. This is in addition to the chapter projects to which all members contribute.

Section 5. The chapter shall publicize and promote its projects in a positive manner.

#### ARTICLE X: DISCIPLINE and DISMISSAL of MEMBERS

Section 1. Any member who falls below the standards of scholarship, leadership, character, or service may be considered for discipline or dismissal from the Goshen High School chapter of the National Honor Society. A member of the National Honor Society is expected to maintain his/her academic standing and take an active role in service and leadership to his/her school and community.

Section 2. If a member's cumulative grade point average falls below the standard in effect

when he/she was selected (3.75 cumulative weighted), he /she will be given a written warning and a reasonable time period for improvement. If the cumulative grade point average remains below standard at the end of the warning period, the student will be subject to further disciplinary action by the Faculty Council that could include dismissal from the chapter. Members will be given the opportunity to write a letter to the Faculty Council pleading his or her case. The Faculty Council has the final say in the disciplinary action of the member.

Section 3. Violations of the law or school regulations can result in immediate dismissal of a member (see Section 5 below). These violations include, but are not limited to DWI, stealing, destruction of property, cheating, truancy, or possession, selling, or being under the influence of drugs or alcohol at school or school-related activities or in the community.

Section 4. Offenders of the school conduct code (such as use of profanity, failure to comply, unexcused absences, excessive tardiness, etc.) will receive written warning notification. A conference may be requested by either party (Faculty Council or student/parent). If the member is involved in another violation of the school conduct code, the member may be considered for dismissal. Please consult the chart below for specific violations and their consequences. Any blatant disregard for the school code of conduct shall be dealt with by the adviser on an individual basis. The accumulation of two tier one offenses will result in possible dismissal.

Section 5. Chapter officers, as representatives of the chapter, can be removed from their positions as a consequence of disciplinary action taken by the Faculty Council.

Section 6. In all cases of pending dismissal:

- a. The member will receive written notification from the adviser/Faculty Council indicating the reason for consideration of dismissal.
- b. The member will be given the opportunity to respond to the charge(s) against him/her at a hearing before the Faculty Council prior to any vote on dismissal (in accordance with due

process identified in Article X of the National Constitution). The member has the opportunity to present his/her defense either in person or via a written statement presented in lieu of the face-to-face hearing. Following the hearing, the Faculty Council will then vote on whether to dismiss. A majority vote of the Faculty Council is needed to dismiss any member.

- c. The principal will be notified of the results of the Faculty Council vote. The results will be stated in a letter sent to the student and parents. Dismissed members must surrender any membership emblems to the adviser.
- d. The Faculty Council's decision may be appealed to the building principal and afterwards according to provisions of the school district discipline policies.
- e. A member who is dismissed or resigns, may never again be considered for membership in the National Honor Society.

Section 7. In lieu of dismissal, the Faculty Council may impose disciplinary sanctions upon a member as deemed appropriate.

## ARTICLE XI: RATIFICATION, APPROVAL, and REVIEW.

Section 1: These bylaws will be approved upon receiving a <u>two-thirds</u> affirmative vote of all active members of the chapter, a majority affirmative vote of the Faculty Council, and approval by the administration.

Section 2: These bylaws shall be reviewed and if necessary, revised within five years from the date of approval noted on this document.

# ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended by a <u>2/3rds vote</u> of the chapter, provided notice of the proposed amendment has been given to members at least <u>one month</u> prior to the vote. The exceptions are Articles V and X, which are developed by the Faculty Council with the approval of the principal (selection and discipline).
