

## Magnolia Intermediate School Discipline Policy

### ***Classroom Behavioral Interventions***

Discipline in the public schools of our nation continues to be a matter of great concern to educators and parents alike. Since discipline is essential to academic progress, the teachers and staff at Magnolia work together to encourage productive behavior in a firm, fair, consistent manner.

Our school discipline plan is based on the premise that teachers are here to teach and students desire to learn. Therefore, no student will be allowed to stop the teacher from teaching or interfere with the learning of other students.

When students make a personal choice to obey established rules, positive consequences will occur, such as verbal praise, notes of recognition to the students and parents, special activities, etc.

When a student makes a deliberate choice to disobey an established rule, some or all of the following interventions may be used at the teacher's discretion:

- Conference with student
- \*Refocus
- Parent contact by teacher
- Teacher assigned Lunch Detention
- Parent/Student Teacher Conference
- Written behavioral contract
- Classroom visitation by the parent

\*A Refocus area may be assigned in the classroom or in an alternate supervised classroom as part of the classroom management program.

**When these interventions fail to bring about proper conduct, the student will be referred to a school administrator for disciplinary action to be administered according to the guidelines.**

### ***Definition of Terms***

1. **Lunch Detention:** Teacher or administrator assigned detention to be served during lunchtime.
2. **Community Service:** Administrative assigned work project to be served during lunch or after school.
3. **After School Detention:** Administrative assigned detention to be held for one hour after school.
4. **Saturday School:** Student attends study center for four hours on Saturday morning from 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M. Students will be under the supervision of a Saturday School Teacher.
5. **Home Suspension:** Removal of student from school for 1 – 5 days. Students are not to enter upon any Pleasant Ridge School district campus or any adjacent street during the suspension period.
6. **School Attendance Review Board (SARB):** The purpose of the School Attendance Review Board is to provide for intensive guidance and coordinated community services to meet the special needs of students with school attendance and/or school behavioral problems.
7. **Expulsion:** The student loses privilege of attending Magnolia Intermediate School for a period of time up to one year as determined by the School Board.
8. **On Campus Suspension (OCS):** Student is suspended from classes and is housed in a room separate from the rest of the student population. Students are supervised by a school employee

### ***Grounds for Disciplinary Action***

A student may be suspended or expelled upon a first offense for violations of Education Code, Section 48900, or whenever it is determined that the student's presence in school causes danger to persons or property or threatens to disrupt the instructional process.

- a. Causing, attempting, or threatening to cause physical injury to another person.
- b. Possessing, furnishing or selling a firearm, knife, explosive or other dangerous object.
- c. Possessing, selling, furnishing, using or being under the influence of any illegal drug, alcoholic beverage or intoxicant.
- d. Offering, arranging, or negotiating to sell any controlled drug, alcoholic beverage or intoxicant of any kind.
- e. Committing or attempting to commit robbery or extortion.
- f. Causing or attempting to cause damage to school property or to private property.
- g. Stealing or attempting to steal school property or private property.
- h. Possessing or using tobacco.
- i. Committing an obscene act or engaging in habitual profanity or vulgarity.
- j. Offering or selling any drug paraphernalia.
- k. Disrupting school activities or willfully defying the valid authority of school personnel.
- l. Knowingly receiving stolen school property or private property.
- m. Possessing an imitation firearm.
- n. Committing or attempting to commit sexual assault or battery.
- o. Harassing, threatening or intimidating a student who is a witness for the purpose of preventing that student from being a witness or retaliating against a student for being a witness.

### ***Truancy Procedure***

1. Parents will be notified regularly by the school concerning truant **absences**. Students who are truant from school will be assigned Saturday School.
2. If a student is truant three times, parents will be contacted and an attendance letter sent home.
3. Further trancies could lead to one or more of the following actions:
  - (a) classification of the student as a habitual truant.
  - (b) referral to the School Attendance Review Board (SARB).

### ***Cheating***

Cheating is defined as any use or attempt to use the work efforts of another student to benefit their grade status with or without the consent of that student. Both (or all) students involved in the incident should be held accountable for the consequences. (i.e., zero on papers, or student involved share the points of one assigned grade on the work). Remember, cheating cheats *you* of knowledge.

### ***Academic Performance***

Students are expected to complete all assignments regularly. If a student fails to comply it may result in an academic performance violation. Classroom policy shall dictate performance expectations

**When teacher interventions fail to bring about proper conduct, a discipline referral will be written and the student will meet with a school administrator for disciplinary action.**

### **Administrative Interventions**

The following pages list consequences that students can expect if they choose to violate school rules. It is to be used as a guide and is not binding upon school authorities, except as prescribed by the governing board and legal authority.

### **Tardies**

Students must be seated in the classroom when the bell rings. Students will receive consequences for tardies to class for each trimester.

1 <sup>st</sup> tardy	Warning and documentation by teacher
2 <sup>nd</sup> tardy	Lunch detention and signed parent detention slip
3 <sup>rd</sup> tardy	Lunch detention and teacher/parent direct notification
4 <sup>th</sup> tardy	Referral and 1 hour after school detention
5 <sup>th</sup> tardy	Referral and OCS
6 <sup>th</sup> tardy	Referral and 4 hours Saturday School, Parent administrative conference

### **Infraction**

1. Class disruption beyond steps in classroom management system
2. Hands off policy
3. Abusive or profane language
4. Public display of affection (e.g. hugging, holding hands, kissing)
5. In unauthorized area
6. Failure to attend lunch detention
7. Class truancy or class walk-out
8. Abuse of hall pass
9. Refusal to identify oneself, giving a false name, or falsifying information to school personnel
10. Forgery
11. Throwing of objects (rocks, pebbles, pencils, etc.)

21. Threatening Students	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 – 5 days Home Suspension, possible referral to Police
22. Unauthorized Entry to or Use of School Facilities	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 – 5 days Home Suspension, possible referral to Police
23. Assault or Battery upon any School employee (threatening, attempting to hit or push)	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police
24. Assault or Battery upon any Student (Premeditated or Unprovoked)	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police

25. Providing any Medication, Including inhalers.	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 - 5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police
26. Possession of any weapon	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 - 5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police, Penal Code Violation
27. Possession of any illegal Drug, Alcohol, or Intoxicant	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 - 5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police, Penal Code Violation
28. Sexual Harassment	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	1 - 5 Day Suspension and possible recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police
29. Sexual Assault or Sexual Battery	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	5 Day Suspension and recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police, Penal Code Violation
30. Offering to Sell a Controlled Substance	1 <sup>st</sup> Violation	5 Day Suspension and recommendation for Expulsion. Referral to police, Penal Code Violation
