Types of Financial Aid

Scholarships

- Money given by colleges, private agencies or people to pay for college and they do not have to be paid back
 - Scholarships are everywhere, you just have to look for them
 - Sometimes renewable, sometimes not
 - Usually require some sort of application
 - The requirements for different scholarships vary so be sure to read all of the application information
 - Be prepared to write personal essays and submit letters of recommendation

Types of Financial Aid

Grants

- Money given by the government or another agency to pay for college and college expenses
- Usually does not have to be paid back
- Usually given based on need
- Work Study
 - Part time jobs on or off campus that provide money to pay college expenses
 - Only available to students who show financial need


Types of Financial Aid

A CONTRACT OF THE PARTY OF THE

Loans

- Money given by the federal government or another lending institution to pay for college expenses
- MUST BE PAID BACK
- Different types of Federal Loans
 - Stafford Loans
 - Subsidized and Unsubsidized
 - PLUS Loans (for parents)
 - Perkins Loans

FAFSA



- Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Federal Program to obtain federal money but is also necessary for many scholarships
- Can apply after January 1st of students senior year, must be in by March 1st
- Apply for PIN numbers www.pin.ed.gov
- Parents need to do taxes early or be prepared to estimate income tax

The Accounting Office (Bursar) will charge your bill for tuition, fees, room and board. Your Total Award will be credited in two equal amounts (fall semester/spring semester) to help cover your bill.

The financial aid awarded typically does not cover books, supplies, miscellaneous expenses and transportation. It is the student's responsibility to earn sufficient funds over the summer to pay for these expenses. Money earned while working on campus will also help pay for these expenses. However, please note that the first paycheck from campus employment is not issued until the last week of September.

College Athletic Eligibility

- If you are interested in playing college athletics make sure to register with the NCAA Clearinghouse or the NAIA Eligibility Center
- Links to these websites can be found on the Bishop Ward website under College 101
- ACT Scores need to be sent directly to the eligibility center.
- This must be done by the end of your junior year
- Students and Parents need to review all of the eligibility criteria for athletics and academics.
 Specific core courses are needed.
