Dr. Platter said examples of priorities might include what types of programs should be offered, whether intervention programs are needed, and what resources are necessary to carry out these priorities.

The new local control accountability plans are required by the state's local control funding formula, which gives Inland districts more money.

Districts with more students from low-income homes or who are learning English as a second language or are in foster care will receive a larger share of funds, aimed at programs and resources to raise student achievement.
