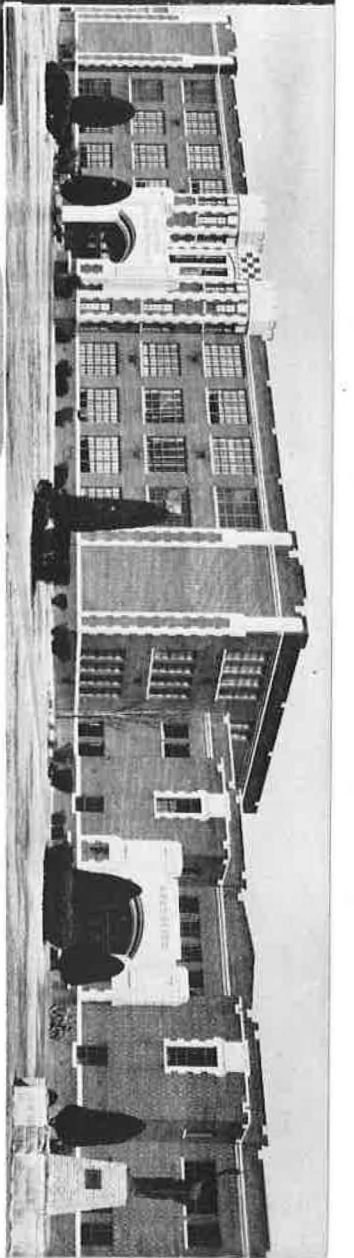
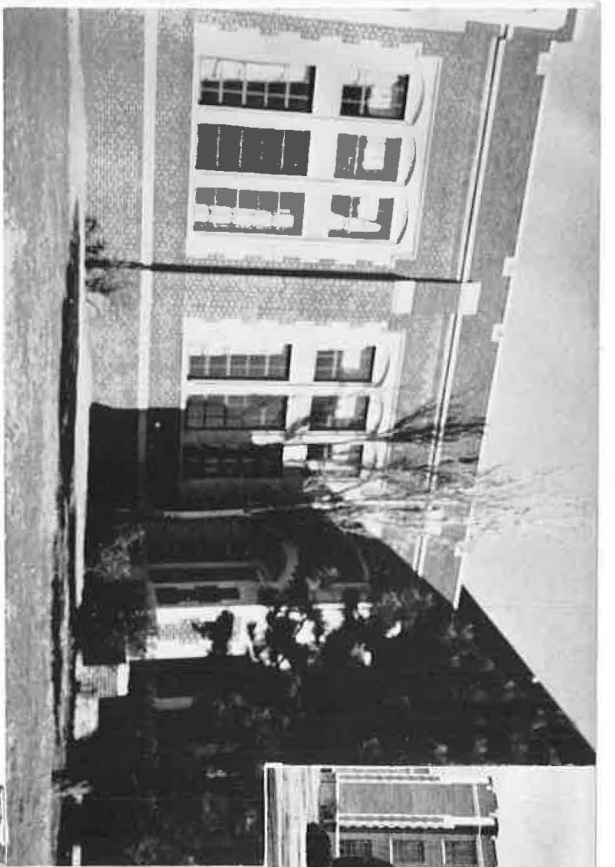

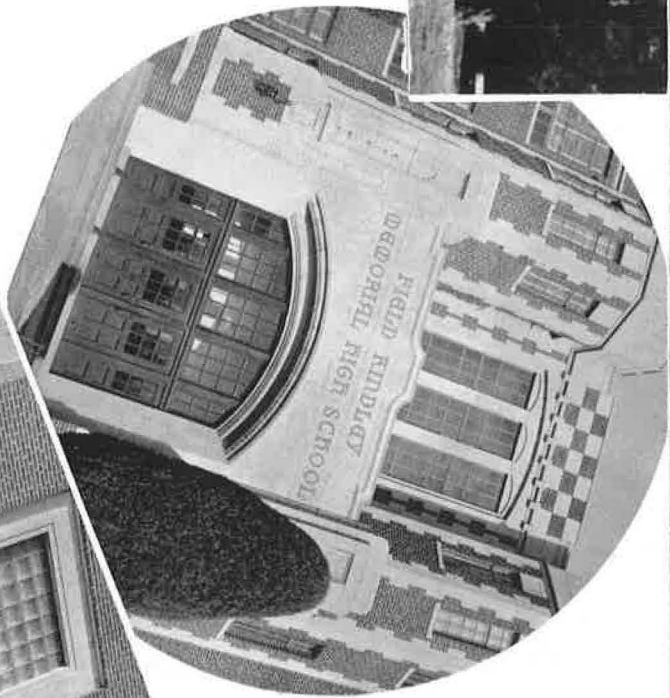

We sincerely hope that good fortune will be with her through the coming years.

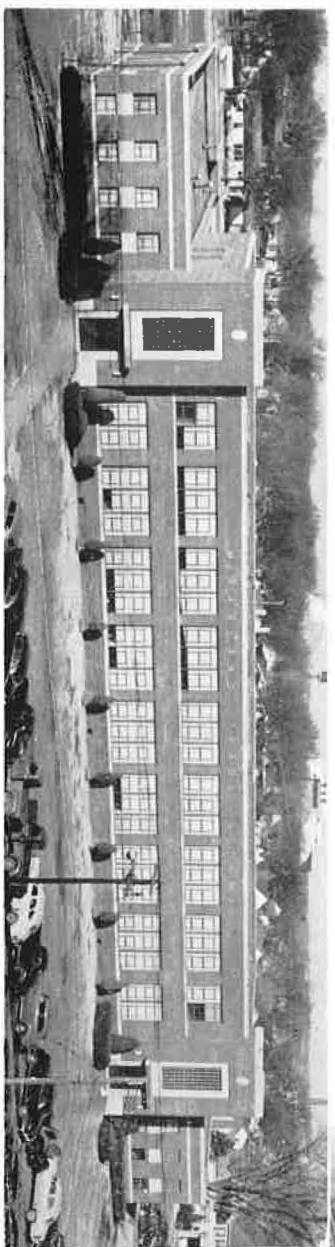




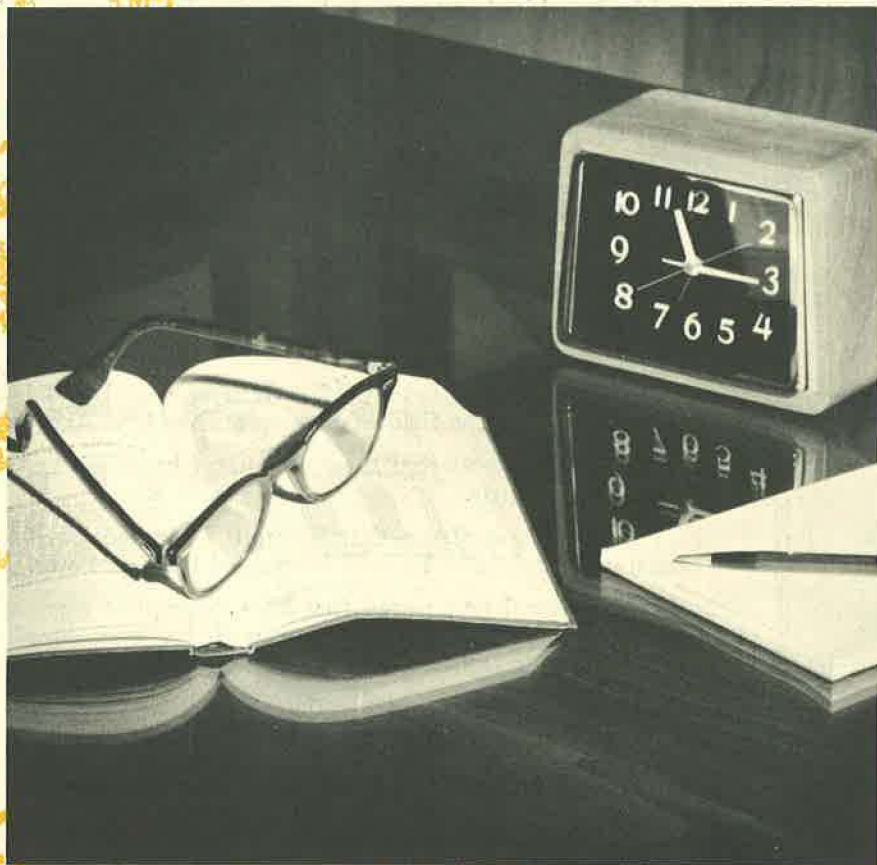

Another amazing fact about the meet was that every existing record was broken in the preliminaries of each race and then these new marks were topped in the finals of each event.

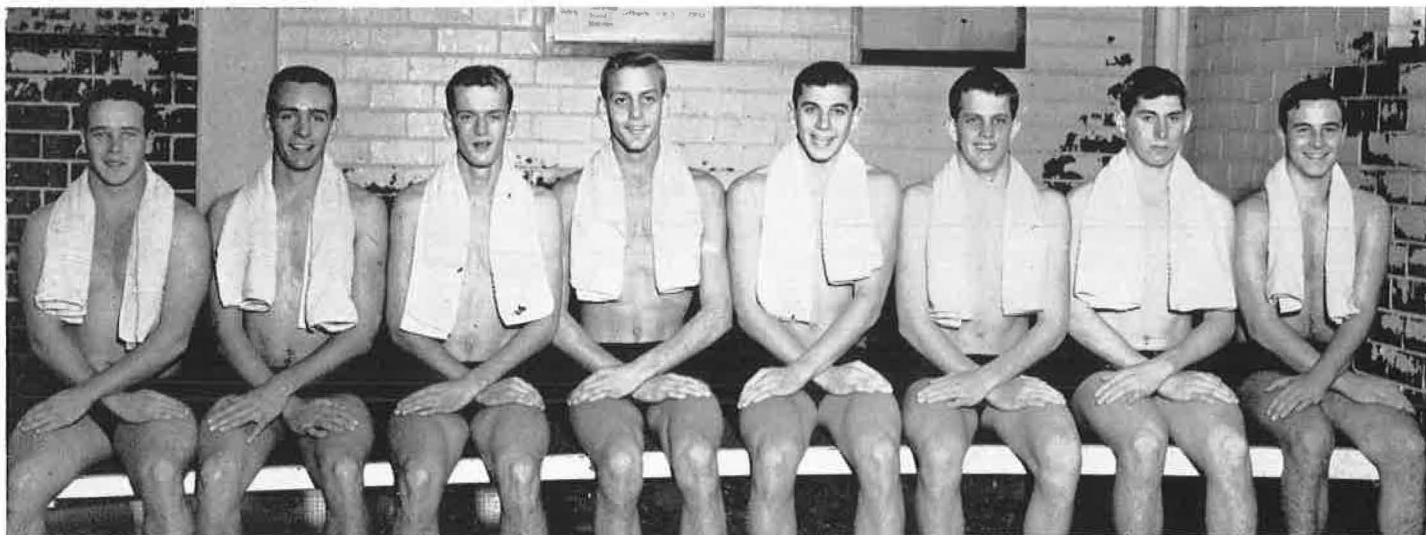

David Bynum and Rollie Tesh won third place trophy at the Fort Scott tournament. Richard Medley and Raymond North won third place at the El Dorado tournament.

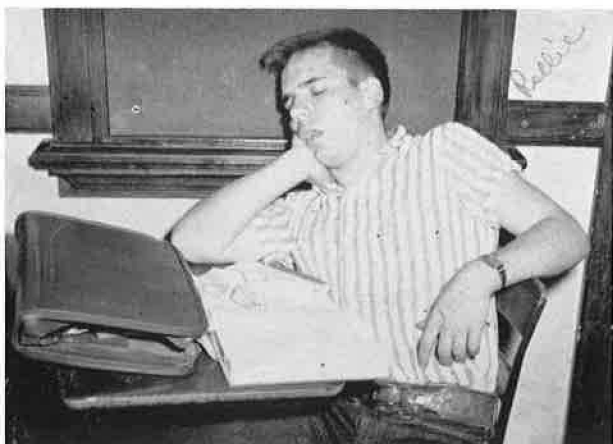
At Hutchinson David Bynum and Rollie Tesh took second.

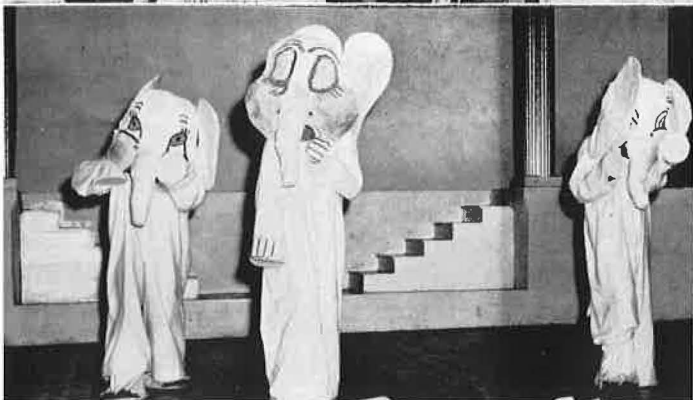
