ELIGIBILITY FOR ACADEMIC AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

To qualify for student academic awards and recognition, a student must be regularly enrolled on a full-time basis at the middle school or high school level. High School full time enrollment shall be defined as enrollment in a minimum of five classes per semester for the applicable reference period. Honor rolls are established on nine week and semester basis. Class rank distinction such as valedictorian and salutatorian are established based upon total high school (four year) regular attendance at an accredited school.

Upon transfer to the Panorama Community School District, credit toward graduation may be allowed for prior education in a public or parochial accredited school setting or alternative educational setting. The amount of credit to be accorded shall be determined by administration based upon a qualitative analysis of the credits earned at prior accredited schools as they relate to the graduation requirements of the Panorama Community School District. For prior experience in an alternative setting or non-accredited school, administration will qualitatively analyze the experience and may potentially accord a reasonable amount of credit based upon such qualitative analysis of the non-accredited school or alternative educational experience. Students who have not attended an accredited school for at least two of their high school years or who have not completed an equivalent number of credits shall not be eligible for scholastic awards such as top ten percent, valedictorian, salutatorian, class rank, etc.
