

HIGH SCHOOL EXPELS BOY FOR DRINKING

Hackensack (N. J.) Board of
Education Acts at Once on
Principal's Charge.

OTHERS ARE SUSPECTED

Officials Demand Immediate Action
Against Places Selling
Liquor.

HACKENSACK, N. J., May 10.—George Winters, 16 years old, of Oradell, was dismissed from the Hackensack High School following a meeting of the Board of Education tonight when charges were made that the lad was intoxicated at school. Winters confessed to members of the board that he left school and obtained liquor at a saloon in Fairmount. He had been suspended this morning by Principal E. T. Marlatt.

Principal Marlatt said that he had suspected for some time that students at the high school were drinking during school hours, but had been unable to obtain substantiating evidence.

"If there are any places in Hackensack that sell liquor to high school students every means should be used by the local authorities to have the practice stopped at once and the offenders severely punished," the principal said.

According to students at the school, there are more than a score of places in Hackensack where they can buy liquor.

President John Sturge of the Board of Education said that the board was determined to close places that were selling liquor to students.

"We will not tolerate such a thing," he said. "I firmly believe that if such a condition exists the local authorities should take steps immediately to close the places concerned, and if they do not do so the Board of Education will see that they do."
