

Parent Commitment:

- 1. Parents are expected to make a <u>minimum six year</u> commitment (research states that academic proficiency can take 4-7 years).
- 2. The duration of the enrollment ensures full development of both Spanish and English language skills.
- 3. Parents do not need to be bilingual in order for their child to succeed in a dual immersion program. However, parents must support bilingualism and their child's second language learning, in its totality.
- 4. Parents can contribute to the school program in a variety of ways i.e. planning cultural events, working on fundraisers and being involved in school governance types of committees.
- 5. Parents are encouraged to become familiar with the second-language acquisition process to help support a child's second-language learning.

Enrollment:

DUAL LANGUAGE IMMERSION PROGRAM

Mission:

The Mission of NCLUSD Dual Language Immersion Program is to provide a rigorous educational opportunity of choice that students will be linguistically and academically successful, value diversity, to attain a global perspective and develop a community spirit, supported by staff, parents and the community.

What is Dual Language Immersion?

Dual Language Immersion is a research based language program model with proven results where the outcome for both native English and native Spanish speakers is to become literate and fluent in two languages.

Program Design: 90/10 Model

Use of Spanish and English language is monolingual at all times. Teachers do not mix language during instruction and use of translation for comprehension is not permitted. Rather, teachers use a variety of second language acquisition methods to make language and content comprehensible for all students.

Teachers in Kindergarten, first and second grade exchange classes with each other during English language development time. In this way, students identify a particular teacher with Spanish and another with English.

Research:

English Learners Long Term K-12 Achievement on Standardized Tests in English Reading Compared Across Seven Program Models

Thomas and Collier (1996 & 2000) compared the effectiveness of programs for English learners. Their findings indicated that two way bilingual immersion programs and late exit bilingual programs with content ESL were the only programs where ELs reached the 50% in English reading and maintained it through 12th grade.
