Student Growth Percentile (SGP)

Student growth percentile is calculated by comparing a student's growth year-over-year with his/her peers (similar prior year California Standards Test score). The advantage of this calculation is that it measures how much a student has grown in absolute performance as a result of teacher instruction. Ranges for SGP used to determine effectiveness are: 1 = 0-34.9%, 2 = 35-49.9%, 3 = 50-69.9%, 4 = 70-100%.
