Working in groups of four, imagine you are participating in a talk show program to get to know your classmates. One of the members of your group will be the host(ess) and the other three will be guests on the show. Think about what kinds of questions a host(ess) asks. What do you want to learn about your classmates?

Include questions that incorporate greetings, introducing yourself and others, saying where people are from, and describing likes and dislikes. The host(ess)'s

goal is to find out as much information about the guests as possible. The guests should also ask the host(ess) questions to gather information during their conversation on the show. This way, all four team members have the opportunity to answer and ask questions. Once your group has completed planning how the talk show will run and has decided on questions, perform your show for the class.



Materials: colored markers or pencils, name tags

Preparation:

- Decide who will play the role of host(ess).
- Brainstorm appropriate personal questions for the host(ess) to ask the guests.
- Plan the sequence of questions that the host(ess) will ask.
- Practice answering the questions, introducing yourselves, saying where you are from, and expressing what you like and dislike.
- Choose the order of appearance of the guests on the show.
- Stage a mock TV presentation of your talk show.
- Members of the class who are the talk show audience take notes during the TV show. After the show, discuss what the audience has learned about your participation in the show.
