

I WILL, YOU WILL, WE WILL, THEY WILL, ETC.

EL FUTURO - FUTURE TENSE

The future tense is used when you want to use the word "will". (For example, I **will** be ready. He **will** help you. We **will** go with her. Etc.) This form of Spanish verbs is really easy. All you have to do is add these endings to the infinitive verb. That's right! Don't conjugate the verb like present tense. Just add these endings to the unchanged verb: (These endings are the same for **ALL** verbs)

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é	emos
ás	éis
á	án

Once you have added the endings to the verb, the words should look like these:

I will speak	yo hablaré	nosotros hablaremos	we will speak
you will speak	tú hablarás	vosotros hablaréis	you all will speak
you will speak he will speak she will speak it will speak	Usted él hablará ella	Ustedes ellos hablarán ellas	you all will speak they will speak (m) they will speak (f)

There are some irregular verbs in this category too. Here they are:

caber = to fit

cabré, cabrás, cabrá, cabremos, cabréis, cabrán

decir = to say, to tell (**predecir**-to predict, **maldecir**-to curse will work like decir)

diré, dirás, dirá, diremos, diréis, dirán

haber = to have (done something) (auxiliary verb)

habré, habrás, habrá, habremos, habréis, habrán

hacer = to do, to make (**deshacer**-to take apart, **satisfacer**-to satisfy will be like hacer)

haré, harás, hará, haremos, haréis, harán

poder = to be able (can you)

podré, podrás, podrá, podremos, podréis, podrán

poner = to put (**componer**-to compose, **disponer**-to dispose will be like poner)

pondré, pondrás, pondrá, pondremos, pondréis, pondrán

querer = to want, to wish, to like a lot, to love

querré, querrás, querrá, querremos, querréis, querrán

saber = to know

sabré, sabrás, sabrá, sabremos, sabréis, sabrán

salir = to leave, to go out

saldré, saldrás, saldrá, saldremos, saldréis, saldrán

tener = to have (**contener**=to contain, and **detener**=to detain will also be like tener)

tendré, tendrás, tendrá, tendremos, tendréis, tendrán

valer = to be worth (to have value)

valdré, valdrás, valdrá, valdremos, valdréis, valdrán

venir = to come (**prevenir**-to warn will also be like venir)

vendré, vendrás, vendrá, vendremos, vendréis, vendrán

A. All verbs, whether regular or irregular, have the same endings in the future tense.

B. All of the future endings have an accent mark except for **-emos**.

C. The verb **venir** should not be confused with the verb **vender**, which is regular (**venderé, venderás, venderá, etc.**)
