

Analytic Scale for the Archetype Essay about Either Scar or Simba in *The Lion King*

Show evidence of your understanding of simple, compound, and complex sentence types. In each of your body paragraphs, use one or more of each of the three types of sentences listed above.

Use well-placed adjectives and adverbs in your sentences.

_____ of 7 points

Make sure your pronouns agree with your antecedents and that each one is close enough to its antecedent so that you do not have a faulty pronoun reference.

Show at least one example of parallel structure used correctly and meaningfully in the essay.

(Note: The first 35 points relate to Targeted Writing Skills Assessments (TWSA).

Write a thesis sentence as your first sentence in Body 1 that begins like this:

In Disney's 1994 movie The Lion King, Scar...OR In Disney's 1994 movie The Lion King, Simba...

(according to whether you are writing about Scar or about Simba). _____ of 10 points

(When you are typing your essay, place the movie's title in italics; if you are handwriting it, underline the title of the movie). Double space your lines and use Times New Roman, 12 point font.

Write every other line and front side only for your first handwritten draft THEN show evidence of revision between the lines and on the back of the paper once we discuss revision strategies.

_____ of 10 points

Include some evidence from the movie concerning why each Archetype is that particular Archetype; relate each to either Scar or Simba (according to your essay topic).

_____ of 20 points

Focus on one main Archetype for Simba OR one main Archetype for Scar but also include at least **TWELVE** other Archetypes that connect to that character. You may also select Situation Archetypes and Symbolic Archetypes as well as Character Archetypes. Make sure to analyze the character according to the Archetypes and don't write plot summary.

_____ of 25 points

Write and revise your essay in class time Tuesday and Wednesday; continue to revise as you type your essay at home on Wednesday night. **Type your own essay** so that you can revise as you type – own it yourself.

Type your essay on Wednesday night, print a copy of what you have typed, and bring that to class so that you can revise your latest copy when I teach revision strategies on Thursday.

Give me the handwritten draft, all other drafts, your outline you wrote as a list of Archetypes for the character, as well as the typed final, revised draft on Friday, September 27.
