Dr. Plutko announced that Student Board Representative Blake Diamond had been named Orange County Student Athlete of the Week by the Orange County Register, and complimented Blake on both his academic and athletic achievements.

Dr. Plutko stated that an award had been received by the IT Department from CALPADS (California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System) for meeting the initial certification deadline for all six data collections, resolved anomalies to achieve an anomaly rate of less than 2% of enrollment, and maintained quality data. Dr. Plutko indicated that this was a very difficult achievement and he offered kudos to our IT Department.

Dr. Plutko invited an outstanding math teacher in the district, Kendra Rosales, to describe Pi Day which was celebrated in the district on March 14, 2015 to raise awareness. Mrs. Rosales thanked the Board, administration, teachers and students, for allowing this event, which raised \$11,000 for all sites across the district, to take place.

Smarter Balanced testing will begin this spring and 11th grade students will be using technology, Chrome Books and desktop computers to take the exam. IT did an excellent job of piloting this program, but the first year will be a learning time. Dr. Plutko expressed appreciation for the Board's investment in the infrastructure that allows the testing to take less time away from the classroom.

Dr. Plutko encouraged everyone to enjoy the various district art shows and site performances that are taking place.

Owen Crosby, Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, provided an update on the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP). Mr. Crosby reported that he is sending a draft document to the Orange County Department of Education this week. Some time between May 4 and 8 our LCAP will be posted to the district's website to get additional feedback from our stakeholders. He indicated it is not mandatory but is best practice. An LCAP Infographic is being developed to help the department tell its story and process through pictures, and this should be completed by May. At the June 9 Board meeting a public hearing will take place, with the recommendation to adopt the LCAP occurring at the June 30 Board meeting. The final step will be to submit the plan to the Orange County Department of Education for approval.

Mr. Crosby reported on the status of the EPIC partnership, stating that we are going to be working again as we enter into the process next year. This program which was developed by the district will use our LCAP as an example throughout the state as they visit other districts. Mr. Crosby thanked everyone for his or her involvement, particularly the Business and Educational Services Departments.

Ms Castrey asked if the district plans on going ahead with a Strategic Plan in the future. She was assured that the LCAP is an extension of the Strategic Plan and will be used.

Despite past economic uncertainties in the State of California, Huntington Beach Union High School District (HBUHSD) persists in rising above this challenge and continues to be a high performing district with an *actual* 2013-14 unrestricted ending balance of \$23,250,213 (15.5%), also known as, the District's "reserve". This is more than four times the 3% reserve legally required by the state. The *actual* 2012-13 unrestricted ending balance of \$25,998,091 (18.36%), also known as, the District's "reserve". This is more than five times the 3% reserve legally required by the state. As stated in the 2014-15 HBUHSD First Interim Report, the District is *projecting* an unrestricted ending balance of \$25,955,440 (16.7%), also known as, the District's "reserve". This is four times more than the 3% reserve legally required by the state. As the District continues to make prudent financial decisions, DEA recognizes the need to continue our advocacy for adequate public education funding.

With this background in mind, DEA makes the following initial proposal to HBUHSD for the 2015-16 school year.



SUBJECT: MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING – ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY (AT) COURSE

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval is recommended to accept a Memorandum of Understanding from the Tehama County Department of Education, Red Bluff, CA for the provision of an Assistive Technology Course by WOCCESE's Assistive Technology Specialist. The Tehama County Department of Education/SELPA (TCDE) will pay for all costs for this course. No district matching funds are required.

Registration fees and tuition from this course accrue revenue for WOCCESE. All related revenue would be utilized to purchase much-needed trial and assessment equipment.

BACKGROUND:

Assistive Technology is a federally-mandated aspect of Special Education and the Americans with Disabilities Act. We are fortunate within our SELPA to have individuals who have education and expertise within the field of Assistive Technology (AT). However, many other districts, SELPAs, and even departments or offices of Education lack such qualified personnel, as AT is a rather low incidence field.

We became aware of Tehama County's lack of personnel and need last year, and discussed offering a course. We had personnel willing and able to provide professional development and training for TCDE. Upon agreement, the training was provided both in person and via an online distance model. In return, TCDE paid all staffing costs, all travel, and all other associated costs. The revenue realized from this course will be utilized within WOCCESE to purchase needed trial and assessment equipment for WOCCESE districts. This will provide the start of a "library" of current assistive equipment and software.

RESOLUTION EDUCATION PROTECTION ACCOUNT

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012;

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012;

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed by Article XIII, Section 36(f);

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director of Finance shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates made pursuant to Article XIII, Section 36(f) that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year;

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year;

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of school districts, county offices of education, charter schools and community college districts;

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government;

WHEREAS, a community college district, county office of education, school district, or charter school shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the school or schools within its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board;

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost;

WHEREAS, each community college district, county office of education, school district and charter school shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent;

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution;

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by community college districts, county offices of education, school districts and charter schools to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XIII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Act and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.3

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. The monies received from the Education Protection Account shall be spent as required by Article XIII, Section 36 and the spending determinations on how the money will be spent shall be made in open session of a public meeting of the governing board of Huntington Beach Union High School District;

2. In compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, the governing board of the Huntington Beach Union High School District has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Act as attached.



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board adopt a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators during the 2015-16 school year.

Background

1. Title 5 regulations have changed the legal authority concerning waiver requests from the State Board of Education to the Commission on Teacher Credentialing effective July 1, 1994.
2. The District is required to file a Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators each school year prior to requesting any credential waivers or emergency credentials.
3. It has been determined that the District anticipates a need for approximately five teachers on an emergency or provisional credential basis in specific areas.
4. The District may revise its needs as necessary.

Students

Nondiscrimination/Harassment

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in the district's academic and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, and bullying of any student based on the student's actual or perceived race, color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

This policy shall apply to all acts related to school activity or to school attendance occurring within a district school. (Education Code 234.1)

Unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, or bullying, includes physical, verbal, nonverbal, or written conduct based on any of the categories listed above. Unlawful discrimination also shall include the creation of a hostile environment when the prohibited conduct is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it affects a student's ability to participate in or benefit from an educational program or activity; creates an intimidating, threatening, hostile, or offensive educational environment; has the effect of substantially or unreasonably interfering with a student's academic performance; or otherwise adversely affects a student's educational opportunities.

Unlawful discrimination also includes disparate treatment of students based on one of the categories above with respect to the provision of opportunities to participate in school programs or activities or the provision or receipt of educational benefits or services.

The Board also prohibits any form of retaliation against any individual who files or otherwise participates in the filing or investigation of a complaint or report regarding an incident of discrimination. Retaliation complaints shall be investigated and resolved in the same manner as a discrimination complaint.

The Superintendent or designee shall facilitate students' access to the educational program by publicizing the district's nondiscrimination policy and related complaint procedures to students, parents/guardians, and employees. He/she shall provide information on the scope and use of the policy and complaint procedures and take other measures designed to increase the school

Nondiscrimination/Harassment (continued)

community's understanding of the requirements of law related to discrimination. The Superintendent or designee shall regularly review the implementation of the district's nondiscrimination policies and practices and, as necessary, shall take action to remove any identified barrier to student access to or participation in the educational program.

Students who engage in unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, in violation of law, Board policy, or administrative regulation shall be subject to appropriate consequence or discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion for behavior that is severe or pervasive as defined in Education Code 48900.4. Any employee who permits or engages in prohibited discrimination, including discriminatory harassment, intimidation, retaliation, or bullying, shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

All Personnel

Nondiscrimination in Employment

The Governing Board desires to provide a positive work environment where employees and job applicants are allowed equal access and opportunities and are free from harassment in accordance with law. The Board prohibits district employees from discriminating against or harassing any other district employee or job applicant on the basis of the person's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation.

Prohibited discrimination consists of the taking of adverse employment action against a person based on any of the prohibited categories of discrimination listed above.

Harassment consists of any unwelcome verbal, physical, or visual conduct that is based on any of the prohibited categories of discrimination listed above and that is so severe or pervasive that it adversely affects an individual's employment opportunities, has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the individual's work performance, or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

The Board also prohibits retaliation against any district employee or job applicant who complains, testifies, assists, or participates in the district's complaint procedures instituted pursuant to this policy.

Any district employee who engages in prohibited discrimination, harassment, or retaliation or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to engage or attempt to engage in such behavior in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Any employee or job applicant who believes that he/she has been or is being discriminated against or harassed in violation of district policy should, as appropriate, immediately report to his/her supervisor, designated compliance officer in accordance with AR 1312, or the Superintendent who shall advise the employee or applicant about the district's procedures for filing, investigating, and resolving any such complaint.

Complaints regarding employment discrimination or harassment shall immediately be investigated in accordance with AR 1312.3 – Uniform Complaint Procedures.

Nondiscrimination in Employment (continued)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide training opportunities to employees about how to recognize harassment and discrimination, how to respond appropriately, and components of the district's policies and regulations regarding discrimination.

The Superintendent or designee shall publicize, within the district and in the community, the district's nondiscrimination policy and the availability of complaint procedures. Such publication shall be included in each announcement, bulletin, or application form that is used in employee recruitment.

Philosophy-Goals-Objectives and Comprehensive Plans

Affirmative Action Plan

The Governing Board recognizes a basic commitment to equal opportunity for all individuals in employment and education. It is the policy of the Board to uphold federal and state laws and other directives in promoting an affirmative action program which insures that discriminatory practices are eliminated in all areas of district employment and educational programs.

Education

The Governing Board desires to provide a safe school environment that allows all students equal access and opportunities in the district's academic and other educational support programs, services, and activities. The Board prohibits, at any district school or school activity, unlawful discrimination, including discriminatory harassment intimidation, and bullying of any student based on the student's actual or perceived race color, ancestry, national origin, nationality, ethnicity, ethnic group identification, age, religion, marital or parental status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, or gender expression or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics.

The Board fully recognizes the importance of providing all students with the proper environment to grow emotionally and intellectually through participation in the full range of educational programs and activities. It is the policy of the Board to insure equal educational opportunity in activities which include, but are not limited to, the following: course offerings, guidance and counseling, athletic programs, and testing procedures.

Therefore, the Board believes an affirmative action program is an essential part of all educational policies and programs which seek to develop each student's full potential and foster an appreciation for cultural diversity in our society.

Employment

The Board affirms its position as an equal opportunity employer and upholds the right of every person to be employed and to advance on the basis of merit, ability and potential. Employment discrimination is prohibited on the basis of the person's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation.

All Personnel

Affirmative Action: Recruitment and Selection

The Governing Board shall provide equal employment opportunities for all persons without regard to the person's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation. The Governing Board establishes a program of affirmative action in order to assure that all personnel policies relevant to recruiting, hiring, and promoting employees guarantee equal opportunities for all. (Education Code 44100 et seq.)

Recruitment, selection and employment practices of the district shall provide a concerted effort to hire and promote qualified individuals of minority ethnic background so that the total district staff is representative of student and community populations of the district. The administration shall make an effort to assign staff to each school so that a reasonable representation of the student population is achieved.

Administrators shall periodically reaffirm and review the affirmative action policy and its application in order to ensure compliance with affirmative action provisions of law.

This policy shall be publicized throughout the district and community and its intent made explicit in all district manuals and publications.

All Personnel

Civil and Legal Rights

The personal life of an employee is not an appropriate concern for attention of the Governing Board except as it may directly prevent the employee from properly performing his/her assigned functions during the workday.

Employees shall be entitled to full rights of citizenship, and religious or political activities of any employee or the lack thereof shall not be grounds for any discipline or discrimination with respect to the professional employment of such employee, providing said activities do not violate any local, state or federal laws.

Nondiscrimination

The conditions of employment in the district, including wages, hours, terms and benefits, shall be applied without regard to the person's actual or perceived race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, pregnancy, physical or mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, veteran status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, or sexual orientation. Thereby, the Governing Board seeks to extend the advantages of public education with full equality of educational opportunity to all students and personnel.

Grievances

No employee, employee association representative, member of any employee organization or any other participant in a grievance procedure shall suffer reprisals in any way or suffer any professional disadvantage by reason of participation in the processing of any grievance. The Superintendent will provide procedures for alleged violations of Title IX, Equal Educational Opportunity Act.

Discipline

No employee will be disciplined, reprimanded, reduced in rank or compensation or deprived of any professional advantage without just cause.

Civil and Legal Rights (continued)

Association Membership

No employee shall suffer any professional disadvantage by reason of the employee's membership in an employee association or participation in its lawful activities.

Sexual Discrimination/Harassment

There shall be no discrimination against any employee or applicant on the basis of sex. Sexual harassment of or by any employee shall not be tolerated.

Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature constitute sexual harassment when:

1. Submission to the conduct is made either an explicit or implicit condition of employment.
2. Submission to or rejection of the conduct is used as the basis for an employment decision affecting the harassed employee.
3. The harassment substantially interferes with an employee's work performance or creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

An employee or applicant who feels that he/she has been discriminated against because of his/her sex or sexual orientation should report such incidents to his/her supervisor, the supervisor of the offending person, or the appropriate personnel office without fear or reprisal. Confidentiality shall be maintained.

In determining whether alleged conduct constitutes sexual harassment, the totality of the circumstances, the nature of the harassment, and the context in which the alleged incidents occurred will be investigated. The appropriate personnel department has the responsibility of investigating and resolving complaints of sexual harassment.
