

Written Portion:

- Conjugation—Conjugate 1 verb in all 4 tenses
 - It will either be a 1st or a 3rd
 - Present, imperfect, perfect, pluperfect
 - You will be given all principle parts
- Conjugate sum in all tenses also
- Declension—Decline one noun for each declension 1-5
 - This means 5 different nouns
 - All 5 cases—Nom, Gen, Dat, Acc, and Abl.
 - Singular and plural for each
 - You will only be given the genitive for 3rd declension.

Scantron portion: 150 questions, 2 scantrons

- Vocab—Matching English with Latin definitions
 - Chapters 12-23
- Relative pronouns—choose the correct masculine, feminine, and neuter form for each case/number of qui, quae, quod; M/C
- Demonstrative pronouns—Hic, haec, hoc and ille, illa, illud; M/C
 - Choose the correct case and number (sing/plur) for the words given
- Translation—Match the correct English translation to each Latin verb
 - You will need to know your tenses and persons
 - Look at exercises in your book similar to Ex. 18.6
- Tense: Choose the correct tense for each given Latin Verb. M/C
 - You will be given all principle parts
- Ablative constructions and others--matching
 - Match the Latin sentence with the ablative construction it uses
 - Locative and Accusative of duration of time are also used
- Culture: M/C on notes from the following:
 - Gladiators
 - Roman Education
 - Roman Money/Coin notes
 - Roman Wedding
 - Roman holidays
 - Roman time/calendars
