PRE-IB PHILOSOPHY

Most importantly, the Language Arts II PIBH curriculum is geared toward preparing you for the intensive IB program you will begin next year. Therefore, the *genuine* efforts you take in reading, annotating, writing, listening, discussing, and creating are crucial to your development and success as a scholar.

LITERATURE-BASED LEARNING

In Language Arts II PIBH, literature is used as the basis for deepening your current skills in reading, writing, listening, speaking, and language conventions. Class assignments, compositions, and activities will be based on these areas, which encompass the California State Content Standards for Language Arts (grades 9-10, 11-12). The school site goals for this course are as follows:

- 1. expose students to four different genres of literature (fiction, nonfiction, drama and poetry)
- 2. include works that reflect different cultural viewpoints and historical time periods
- 3. prepare students for the material to be covered during the IB/AP programs/exams...
- 4. complete critical essays, seminars, research, and projects utilizing various literary theories and the elements of depth, complexity, and content imperatives.
