Independent Study for Classroom Assignments and Homework

The Governing Board authorizes the Superintendent or designee to establish an independent study option for eligible students to complete classroom assignments and homework outside of the regular classroom setting. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan and enabling students to reach curriculum objectives and fulfill graduation requirements. As necessary to meet student needs, independent study may be offered on a full-time basis or on a part-time basis in conjunction with part- or full-time classroom study. Independent study involving on-line classes and internship opportunities will be the subject of a separate Board policy.

1 A student's participation in independent study shall be voluntary. Students participating in independent study shall have the right, at any time, to enter or return to the regular classroom mode of instruction.

2 No individual with exceptional needs as defined in Education Code Section 56026 may participate in independent study unless his or her individualized education program specifically provides for that participation.

3 No temporarily disabled student may receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code 48206.3 through independent study. However, if the temporarily disabled student's parent or guardian and the District agree, the student may receive instruction through independent study instead of the home and hospital instruction provided pursuant to Education Code Section 48206.3.

4 The District shall provide appropriate existing services and resources to enable students to complete their independent study successfully.

Parents/guardians of students who are interested in independent study shall contact the school's Principal or designee. The Principal or designee shall approve independent study for an individual student only upon determining that the student is prepared to meet the District's requirements for independent study.

The minimum period of time for any independent study option shall be five consecutive school days. Circumstances that may warrant participation in independent study shall include:

1 Temporary disability or illness which prevents the student from attending school verified by a doctor's note;

2 Death in the immediate family or other family emergency;

3 Other legally excused absences and/or justifiable reasons as authorized by Education Code Section 48205;

4 Observation of religious holidays as defined in Education Code Section 46014:

5 Extenuating circumstances determined by the Principal and the Assistant Superintendent that warrant an individualized educational plan for students to reach curriculum objectives and/or fulfill graduation requirements.

The Governing Board does not authorize Independent Study for unexcused absences or family convenience, such as departure from the school day or week to participate in non-educational activities, including, but not limited to vacation, entertainment, and social family events. Education Code 48205 does not mandate teachers to provide makeup assignments or tests for unexcused absences. Teachers may assign zero credit whenever a student has incomplete work and non-performance. Unauthorized absences shall be recorded as unexcused absences in the student's attendance record and be subject to the truancy law, as well as Board Policy 5121, which authorizes teachers to assign failing grades for excessive unexcused absences.

Independent study course work shall not be provided to any student in advance of the approved term (dates) of the independent study agreement. No independent study contracts will be issued during state testing times.

Independent study entails a commitment by both the parent/guardian and the student. As the student gets older, he/she assumes a greater portion of the responsibility involved. The Principal or designee shall determine that the prospective independent study student understands and is prepared to meet the district's requirements for this program

The Principal or designee shall ensure that a written independent study agreement, as prescribed by law exists for each participating student. (EC 51747) The written agreement shall specify the length of time in which each independent study assignment must be completed. Because excessive leniency in the duration of independent study assignment deadlines may result in a student falling behind his/her peers and increase the risk of dropping out of school, independent study assignments shall be no more than one week for all grade levels and types of program. However, when necessary based on the

specific circumstances of the student's approved program, the Principal or designee may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due, up to the termination date of the agreement.

When a participating student misses three assignments, an evaluation shall be conducted by the teacher, counselor, and Principal to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study. However, a student's written agreement may specify a lower or higher number of missed assignments that will trigger an evaluation when the Principal or designee determines it appropriate based on the nature of the assignments, the total number of assignments, and/or other unique circumstances.
