

If you become a PTSP or Foundation member and volunteer to work at least 1 PTSP or Foundation event this will earn you 5 volunteer hours. A sign in sheet MUST verify services.

WHAT COUNTS TOWARDS VOLUNTEER HOURS:

- . SAC committee duties (duties that are done by the SAC committee members.)
- . Attendance at General PTSP Meetings
- . Attendance at Board Meetings
- . Attendance at Booster Meetings (athletics, choir, band, assigned work @ Booster event, activities working at events)
- . Board Officer duties – (PTSP Board, Foundation Board, BHCA Board and Booster Board duties)
- . Working in classroom – volunteering in the classroom helping teacher with copying, reading, activities, etc.
- . Helping teacher at home (decodable books, book orders, phone calls, cutouts, etc.)
- . Copy Center volunteer
- . Room parent duties (calling parents, planning and setting up for parties and special events for the teacher.)
- . Attendance at orientation meeting
- . Library help – (sorting, filing books, etc.)
- . Lunchroom help (helping monitor classes in the lunchroom, cleaning tables, sweeping, etc.)
- . Workdays (special called workdays for school campus, athletic fields, campus grounds, moving classrooms)
- . Helping at Drop off and pick up area (helping aides with the opening of car doors for children, etc.)
- . Campus maintenance (working on campus upkeep, repair work)
- . Tutoring (tutoring students individually, in groups or in aftercare)
- . Working sports events (helping by coaching, time clock, setting up for sports events, clean up, concession stand)
- . Working at Book Fair
- . Working in used uniform shop (sorting/hanging clothes)
- . Sorting lost and found items
- . Working at Field Day (assisting coaches with events)
- . Hall monitor for FCAT testing
- . Phone calls to parents for school approved communications
- . Soliciting business partnerships to support school with school approval
- . Preparing classroom or grade level crafts, activity packages, etc...at Teacher's direction (Many activities can be accomplished at home; just ask)
- . Approved chaperone on a school approved field trip. You must be in direct supervision of children (not just traveling with your child) and traveling with the group. (Overnight trips required not only school raptor check but also a criminal background check through the Sheriff's office and will require you to have completed the volunteer form which will be submitted by the school prior to your approval as a chaperone for the trip).

Volunteering and service are 2 key elements for earning volunteer credit, however, volunteering at certain events qualify for volunteering as a family support credit. These are:

- . Student of the Quarter Ceremony (attending SOQ 1 hour per family)
- . Restaurant Nights (1 hour per adult, maximum of 2 hours per family).
- . Lunch (attending Thanksgiving lunch, or reg. lunchtime of student – 30 minutes per child, max. 2 hours per family; specify which child)
- . Helping at Bar-B-Q and Fish Fry (set up, serving, clean up; actual time Signed up).
- . Volunteering at Fall Carnival (help set up, clean up, working at any booths, selling tickets, calling for parents volunteer help.)

WHAT DOES NOT COUNT:

- . Parent teacher conference
- . Reading to child
- . Homework help
- . Selling door to door for fund raisers
- . Attending choir/band concerts or events (unless helping teacher as a chaperone.)
- . Attending sports events, Field Day, Pep Rally, Tailgate party
- . Mandatory sports meetings
- . Field Trip meetings (Space Camp, Williamsburg, etc.)
- . Graduations (K, 5th, 8th)
- . Award ceremonies
- . Spelling Bee
- . Speech Ceremony
- . Science Fair, History Fair & Invention Convention (unless judging, helping set up or break down)
- . Just attending Bar-B-Q, Fish Fry, Spring Carnival or Book Fair
- . Shopping for items for Teacher Appreciation
- . Attending event in the classroom (e.g., Christmas parties, Mother's Day Tea, breakfast, awards, parties of any kind)
- . Attending Art Show
- . Carpooling
- . Attending Club inductions
