Part III: International Baccalaureate Writing Requirements

The International Baccalaureate Program places great emphasis on students writing skills, requiring them in both internal and external assessments and year-end exams. Additionally, students are required to produce an Extended Essay and Historical Investigation. The following is a list of writing required for the IB program:

Internal Assessments:

Work done for class is submitted to the classroom teacher who submits a course grade for the high school transcript, and a predicted grade to IBNA (International Baccalaureate North America). Samples of student work are also sent to an external international examiner for grading. These externally moderated scores make up 20-30% of the final diploma score. This gives the student certain control of the results through his/her diligent work.

History: Essay on Historical Investigation (2000 words).

Biology: Lab write-ups of investigative activities in lab notebook.

Visual Arts: Research workbooks containing investigative and reflective pieces.

External Assessments and Year End Examinations:

Year-end exams and products are sent to an outside international examiner for reading. Scores from this work usually make up 70-80% of the final diploma score. The following is a partial list of year-end components:

Language A (English): Two essays based on world literature-1000-1500 words each (4 hours) **Language B (Foreign Language):** a 250-word essay (standard level) or 400 word essay (higher level) from a short menu of options.

History: A two-day exam (5 hours) with written responses to historical documents and topics chosen from a menu of options.

Biology: Developed responses to lab and option questions.

Theory of Knowledge: The TOK course requires a 1200-1600-word essay written on a selected "problem of knowledge" from a list of ten prepared by the IBO. Examples of past problems are: *Evaluate the ways in which emotion might enhance and/or undermine reasoning as a Way of Knowing...How can you or your society ethically decide which knowledge should or should not be pursued?...Should a knower's personal point of view be considered an asset in the pursuit of knowledge, or an obstacle to overcome?*

Extended Essay: This essay is a requirement to the diploma program and is based on independent research in an area of interest to the student. There is a maximum of 4000 words and students use both primary and secondary sources. This essay in designed to prepare students well for the writing assignments at most top universities.
