Your 1st quarter at Moanalua Middle School is coming to an end. Before we move ahead into the break and 2nd quarter, let's take some time to reflect on the past. After all, the past helps to shape the future! **In at least 3 sentences full of lots of detail,** answer the following.

1. What is at least one thing (fact, skill, etc.) you have learned so far in Social Studies that you can use in the future?
2. Do you manage your time well both in school and at home? Explain your answer.
3. If you had to do the Kamehameha Learning Stations again, what would you do differently? Explain why would you do it this way?
4. What was your favorite station during the Kamehameha Learning Stations lesson? Explain why this was your favorite.
5. What would you say is your major strength in Social Studies class? Explain this strength.
6. Explain at least one thing you still need to work on as you continue to grow as a 7th grader.
7. Do you feel you always work well with others? Explain your answer.
8. Do you feel you are or are not a leader? Explain your answer.
9. We are Team Kaleialoha (Lei of Love). Explain how you have been living up to the team name.
10. Imagine you are the Social Studies teacher. What are at least 2 types of activities/lessons you would make for your students? Make sure to explain all the details of your activities/lessons. Remember, as the teacher the students need to learn Social Studies related material or you will be fired!
11. Overall, do you feel more like a 6th grader or more like a 7th grader at this point in time? Explain your answer.
12. If you could repeat the 1st quarter all over again what are at least 3 things you would have done differently? Also explain why you would have done this differently.
13. What are you most proud of so far in this 7th grade year?
14. Perspective is important in Social Studies. It is important to look at things from different perspectives or different points of view. Only by looking at things from different points of view can we get a greater understanding of history and the world around us. Let's practice seeing the world from a different perspective. Pick an ordinary (**and appropriate**) object. Some examples could include a rock, classroom desk, cell phone, etc. Once you pick your object write an **appropriate** story (at least 1 paragraph in length) viewed from the perspective of the object you picked. For example, you could write about "a typical day in the life of a ...". Be creative, have fun but don't forget about perspective.
