“History by Disney” Extra Credit Opportunity – maximum 50 pts

What to do: Imagine you are a history teacher...

Select a 3 to 10 minute clip from a Disney movie, live or animated, and relate it to a historical theme in a 25-30 minute history lesson. The lesson must include the following components (in whatever order works best for your lesson):

- The historical theme of your lesson, including an outline of activities in order of presentation.
- Name of movie, when produced, characters in the clip, the historical connection of this clip, and a brief description of the clip – location, context of clip in movie, plot, etc.
- List and briefly describe 3 to 5 learning objectives – what you expect your “students” to be able to know, describe, identify, connect to, etc. as a result of the lesson. (Example: Students will identify four architectural components of the cathedral of Notre Dame).
- Devise an activity either pre- or post-viewing of the video that accentuates the historical aspect of the lesson. Provide a copy/example of the activity (worksheet, open ended questions for post-viewing discussion, etc.)
- Devise a way to assess the learners’ understanding of the historical material. This can be a quiz, an assignment, a project, etc.
- Produce a presentation script to introduce the lesson to the learners, as well as a summary or wrap up of the lesson.
- Describe the historical connection of the video clip to a particular history period or concept.

Assignment must be TYPED, well organized, and complete in all components listed above. Clearly label each component.

Movie clips may be from recent Disney releases, archival material from “The Wonderful World of Disney,” or other Disney TV movies. Do not include the clip, but if it is available via the Internet, include the URL.
