

Teaching Methods

Varied techniques of instruction and instructional arrangements may be used throughout the school system in accordance with the learning situation and the wishes of the teacher or teacher teams. The techniques and arrangements may include, but are not limited to, the following: team effort, programmed learning, uses of resource people, guest instructors, learning activity packages, student discussion groups, field trips.

The philosophy of the district stresses the development and growth of the individual pupil; therefore, to be consistent with this philosophy, techniques of instruction should be focused on individual needs. There are degrees of individualized instruction, and methods vary with subject areas. Even though individualized instruction does not mean teaching all pupils individually, it does mean that the teacher must think of pupils as individuals and that the learning process be geared to meet their individual needs.
