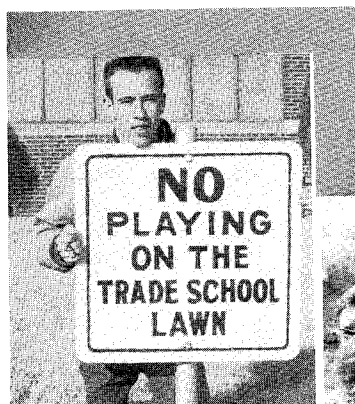


Sigma Pi

Student Council

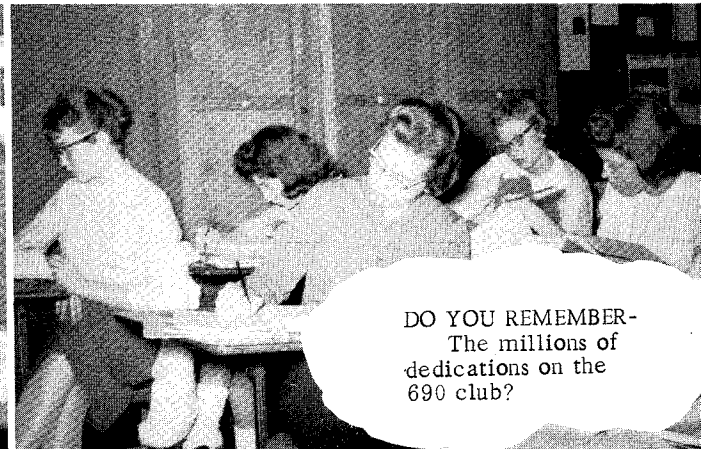

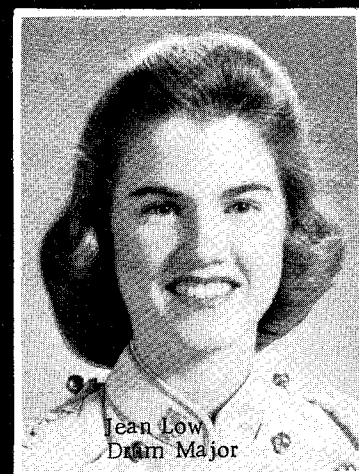
The 25th year of Drum Corps, beginning with practice in June, started off for a round of wonderful memories.

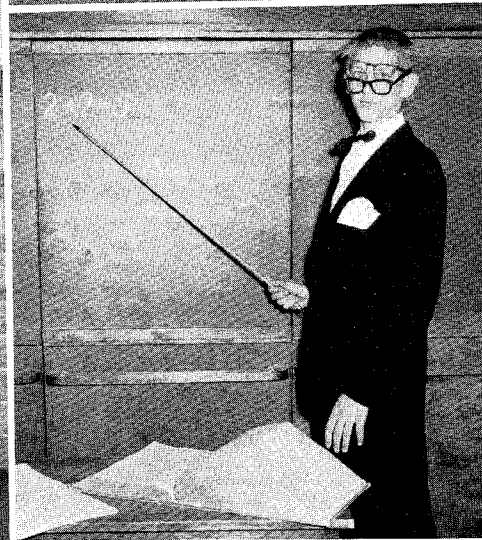


Junior History

After completing this task they set to work on next year's show. The sponsors are, Kenneth Burchinal and Bill Shores.

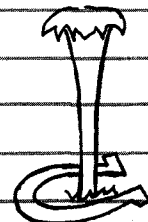
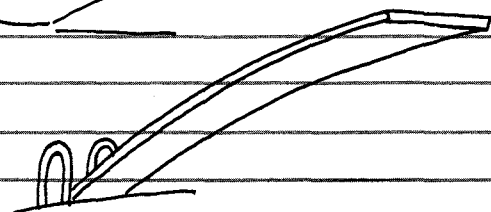
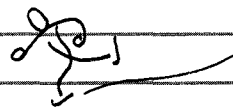
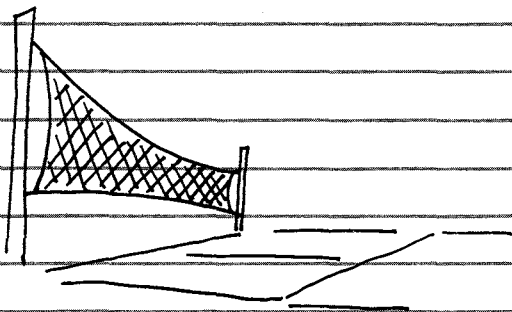
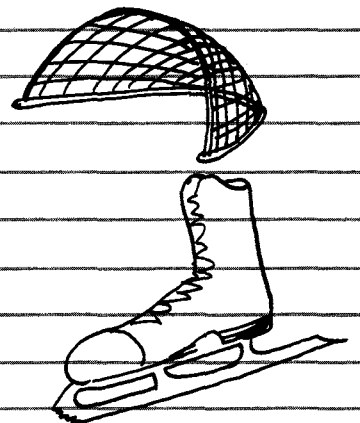
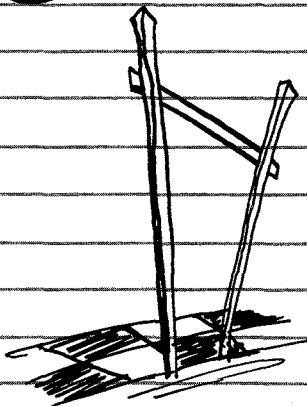

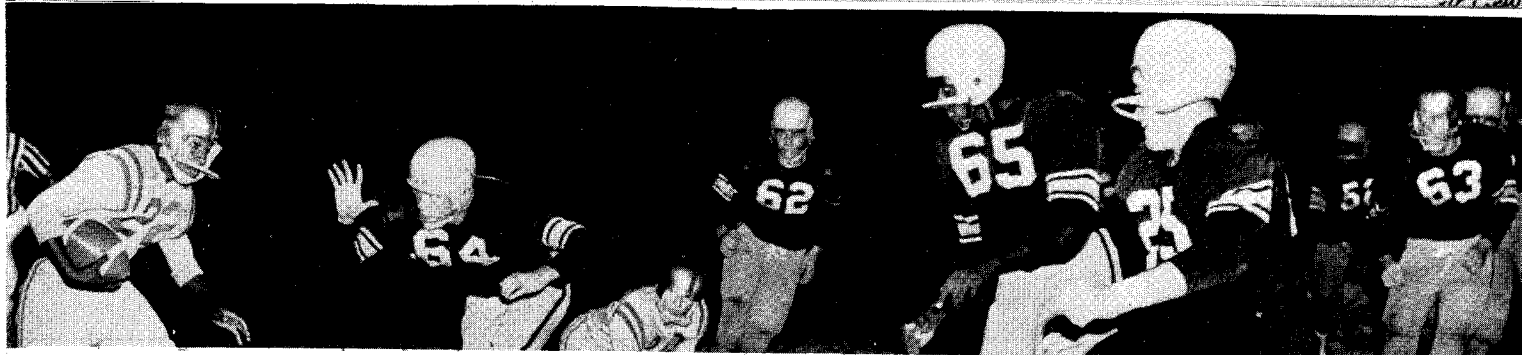
The Golden Tornado

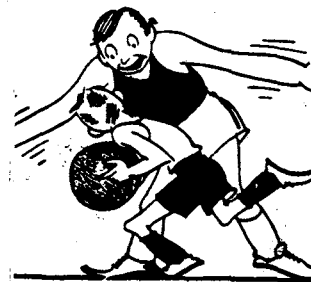
The Golden Gales

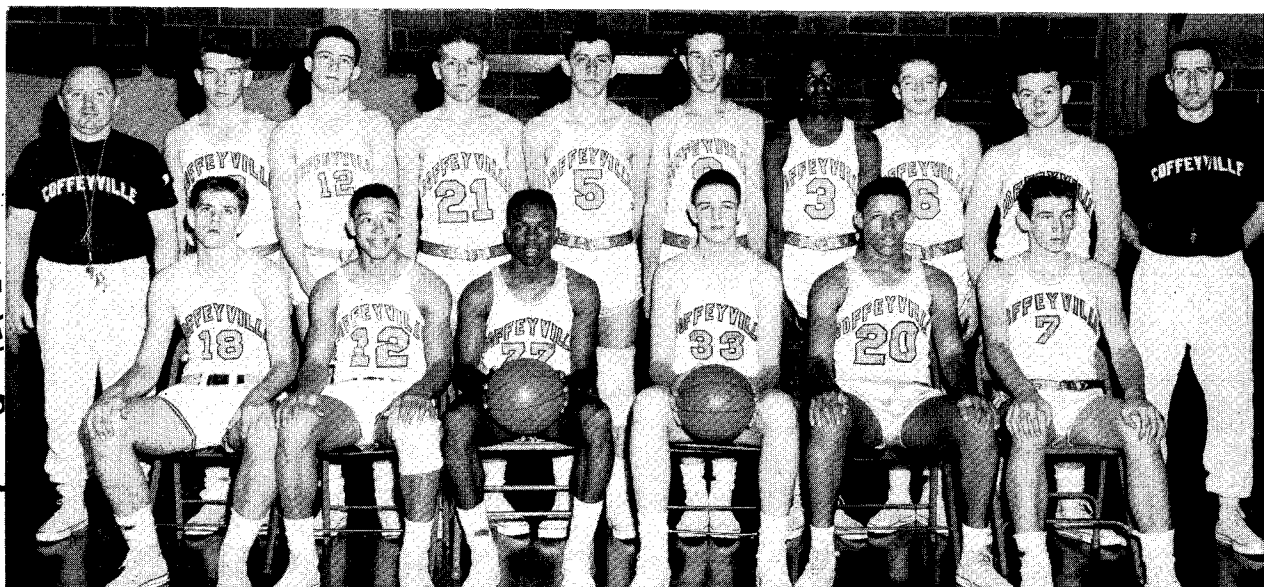


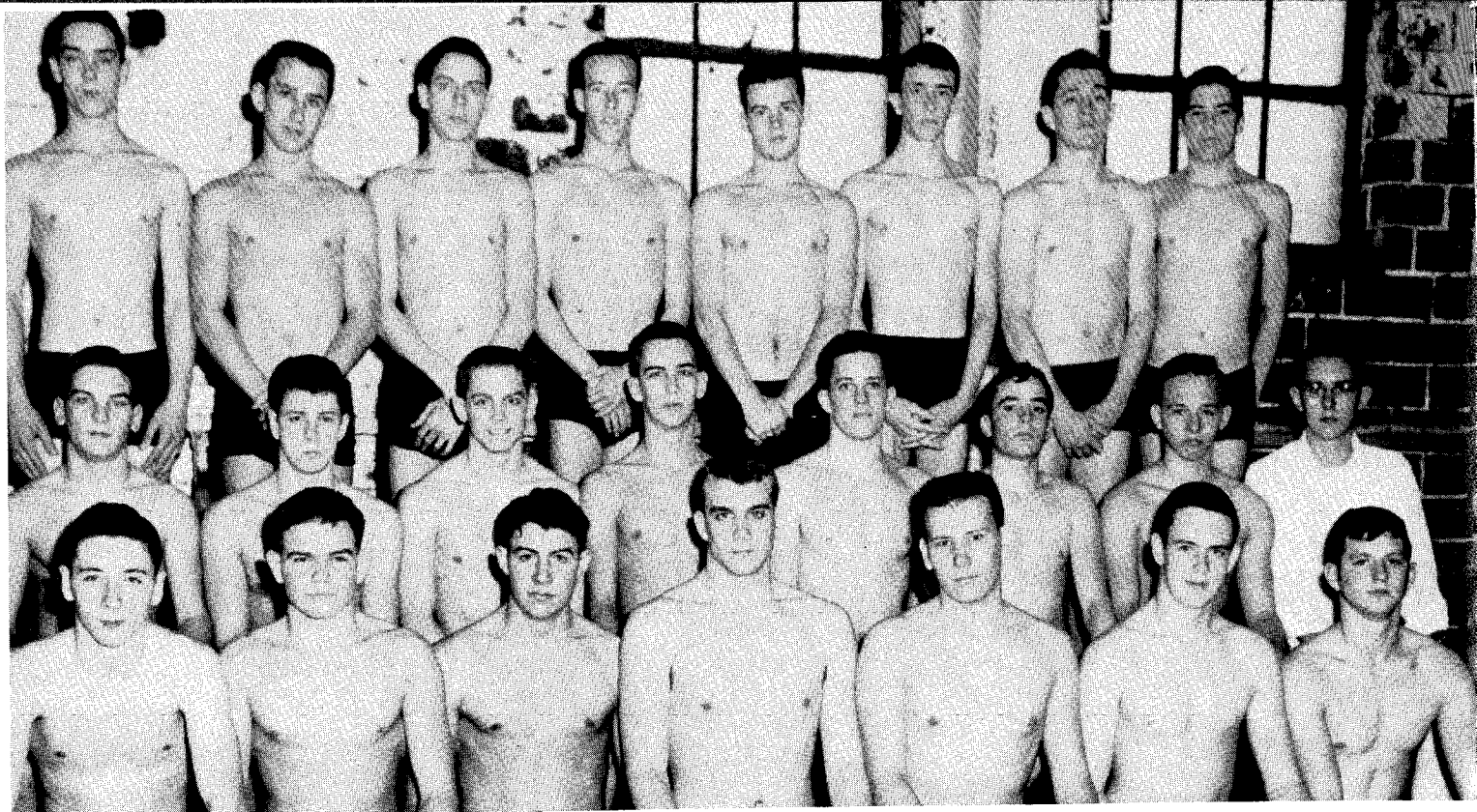
The Golden Gales
