As you might be aware, Le Pera Elementary School received a "D" label this summer from the Arizona Department of Education primarily based on last year's student achievement data.

There were many different factors that led to this label – which was just a few points short of a "C." However, the Rebel Family isn't making any excuses. I can assure you that a "D" is not acceptable for any educator working at Le Pera.

The school leadership has active discussions on a daily basis on how to improve this label in the future – even with the arrival of a more rigorous state standards exam (AzMERIT) this spring. Several programs have already been put into action, including math re-teach and guided reading for those students who are struggling.

One aspect that absolutely can't be overlooked during this effort is the importance of parent involvement. Here is what the latest research has shown:

Lack of parental involvement is the biggest problem facing public schools.

When parents are involved in the learning, students have higher grades, better test scores, better attendance, better self-esteem and fewer instances of negative behavior.

Family participation is TWICE as predictive of academic success as a family's socio-economic status.

The more intensely parents are involved, the more student achievement increases.

When children read at home with their parents, they make SIGNIFICANT gains in reading achievement.

Research also shows that families with children who are doing well display the following characteristics:

Establishes a daily family routine.

Monitors out-of-school activities.

Models the value of learning, self-discipline and hard work.

Expresses high but realistic expectations for achievement.

Encourages progress at school.

Encourages reading, writing and discussion among family members. You don't have to be President of the PTSO to be actively involved. The most important thing all families can do is to simply continue the learning at home. Read together, do math facts together, work on homework together and study together.

Together, we can lift Le Pera to new academic heights. Go REBELS!
