William I of England (1027 – 1087 = 11th century), better known as William the Conqueror (French: Guillaume le Conquérant), was **Duke of Normandy** (Normandy: a French province) from 1035 and **King of England** from 1066 to his death.

To claim the English crown, **William invaded England in 1066**, leading an army of Normans (Frenchmen from Normandy) to victory over the Anglo-Saxon forces at the **Battle of Hastings**, and suppressed subsequent English revolts in what has become known as the Norman Conquest.

His reign, which **brought Norman culture to England**, had an **enormous impact on the subsequent course of England** in the Middle Ages. In addition to political changes, his reign also saw changes to English law, a program of building and fortification, **changes to the vocabulary of the English language**, and the introduction of continental European feudalism into England.
