COURSE OVERVIEW

The AP Spanish Literature and Culture course is a survey course which covers the six AP Spanish Literature themes and the entire reading list outlined within the AP Spanish Literature Curriculum Framework. The course is conducted in Spanish and covers Spanish and Latin American authors, and their works, from the medieval period to the present day. The course and its activities are intended to teach and enhance a student's ability to acquire, identify, understand, discuss, interpret and analyze the form and content of literary works of prose, poetry and drama along with the literary terms and conceptual aspects of art and history of the time. Through coursework and AP Practice Tests, students will be prepared to take the AP Spanish Literature and Culture Exam in May.

COURSE GOALS

- 1. To understand lectures and presentations in Spanish.
- 2. To participate actively in discussion in Spanish on literary topics.
- 3. To do analytical readings of literary texts of all genres in Spanish.
- 4. To analyze critically the form and content of literary works, including poetry, orally and in writing, using appropriate terminology.
- 5. To understand and appreciate Hispanic culture through the studied texts.

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

- Azulejo, Second Edition, Anthology and Guide to the AP Spanish Literature and Culture Course
- Spanish/English Dictionary
- A three-ring binder with three-ring punched writing paper and a place to keep all hand-outs
- Supplies for taking notes; Number 2 pencils, blue or black pen, and a red pen.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- Students will read the texts, comprising the AP Spanish Literature and Culture Required Reading List issued by The College Board. The list spans 7 centuries of literary work. In addition to reading the works, students will participate in the following activities to promote a better understanding of Hispanic Literature, and prepare for the AP test in Spanish Literature:
 - 1. Listening to lectures and online programs and interviews in Spanish, which are related to the various works;
 - Taking notes during these lectures and activities;
 - 3. Watching movies or other online items related to the various works, and commenting on their relationship to the written works;
 - 4. Reading independently outside of the classroom, or in cooperative groups;
 - 5. Summarizing, analyzing and critiquing orally and in written form;
 - 6. Giving oral and written reports in class about the authors and their works, and other related topics.

The works are presented in chronological order with the aim of integrating the historical themes and literary movements of the different time periods, and highlighting the schools of literature to which each piece belongs as well as the author's style and the characteristics of each selection.

HOMEWORK EXPECTATIONS:

Students can expect daily homework. Examples:

- o Daily Readings
- Summary of assigned readings
- Essays
- Text analysis and/or questions based on assigned readings
- Project Assignments
